

# CREED (from the explanation of Luther's Small Catechism) Please Stand

A: With the whole church, let us confess our faith through Luther's Small Catechism.

P: The Second Article: On Redemption

C: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.





### **Stewards in the Bible**

Who are stewards in the Bible? Did you find anyone who worked as stewards in scripture?

A steward is a person who cares or manages for someone else. In other words, a steward works for an owner and provides good care of things belonging to the owner.

In the Old Testament, Joseph was a steward from Pharaoh. Pharaoh put Joseph in charge of all the land of Egypt (Genesis 41: 41-42). Joseph took good care of the land, and people in Egypt had enough food during the time of famine. Read Genesis Chapters 37 to 50 to learn more about Joseph. Next week we will look at stewards in the New Testament.
