Today's gospel reading is from the Spark Story Bible.

The Prodigal Son

Jesus spent time with all sorts of people--even people who had done bad things. This made some people mad. "Why is Jesus always around people who do bad things?" they grumbled. Jesus heard them, so he told them this story.

bag and headed out away from home. The son traveled to a faraway country and spent all his money on fancy parties and food. Soon he had no more money and no place to stay. "The men who work for my father have more than enough to eat and here I am starving to death. I'll go home and say to my father, 'Dad, I made a big mistake. The father put a ring on his son's finger and shoes on his feet and ordered for a party to be thrown for him. 



Spring Choral Concert TODAY


