



The History of Our Quilting Ministry at Good Shepherd and The Piece Corps Group

Why do we make quilts? We know they are needed, both here and around the world. But how did all this get started?

Who asked us to do this? Or did someone just wake-up one morning and decide to start a quilt ministry in Lena? I didn't know-so I called Joyce Tessendorf. She said that Women's Group Chairman-Pat DeMeyer had called her and said she had a "sewing project" and some of the churches were already involved and would our church get involved also? Joyce asked what kind of a sewing project? Well Lutheran World Relief (LWR) needed quilts and the request had come from the synod, and so they asked the women's groups to help. Joyce asked what all this would involve and what would we use to make these quilts, we needed some guidelines. Heavy, old wool coats would be used, rip them apart, cut them into squares and sew them into tops, layer the quilt with a back and some inner lining, and pin them on a quilt frame to tie. Then finish binding the quilt. In the Fall the quilts were packed up and taken to Monroe, Wisconsin for shipment to LWR. The call went out and not only our church members, but the Lena Baptist, Catholic, Methodist, and St. John's Lutheran members also got involved. What should we call ourselves? We need a name! Jeannie Engel, Bill Engel's sister, came up with the name-The Piece Corps.

Jeannie Engel drew and cut out the letters that are still on the bulletin board downstairs. Even though there were as many as 25 to 30 people-mainly women-in those first years, the quilt count was not high, by today's counts. Today we use cotton and other lightweight fabrics, we still rip things apart and cut squares, but the quilt frames have been replaced by long tables.

That call to make quilts came in 1974-45 years ago, and since that time we have made over 16,709 quilts. (See orange sheet in Fellowship Hall bulletin board to see the latest tally and each year's total.) None of this would be possible without the help of many, many hands, lot's of donations, and God's Love and Prayers. Thank you!



A Quilt Ministry is an expression of God's Love

Each and every Wednesday morning – for 45 years, the members of Piece Corps meet at Good Shepherd Church in Fellowship Hall from 8:00am-11:30am to assemble quilts. There are so many people who help make this ministry possible: the sewers, fabric cutters, ironers, quilt tiers, quilt binders, those who supply us with donations of fabric, batting, thread and money, and finally – those who pack-up and transport the quilts to Monroe, Wisconsin and load them on the semi so they get to the people who need them. It costs Lutheran World Relief (LWR) about \$2.25 to deliver one (1) quilt overseas to its final destination.

Each year, on Quilt Sunday, the church is draped with quilts. We thank God that he has given us work to do that impacts so many others. We will never know all the people who benefit from our quilts; but we know God's love and work is never done; and so each year we strive to do our best.

2019 Quilt Count Update: Quilts made this year – 652, plus 32 children/lap size quilts.

Where did out quilts go?

The majority of our quilts are sent to Lutheran World Relief (LWR) for distribution around the world.

We have also sent quilts and other materials to the following this year:

<u>Pine Ridge Indian Reservation</u>: 32 quilts, 6 Brown Blankets, 14 Towels, Large box bath mats. The Holy Cross Catholic Church in Stockton took these items on their mission trip to Pine Ridge, South Dakota.

Rockford Rescue Mission: 30 quilts, 72 pool towels, 48 pillow cases, 34 white towels.

<u>Lutheran Outdoor Ministry Center (LOMC)</u>: 12 quilts, 14 pillows, 14 pool towels.

<u>Veterans in Rockford:</u> (to set-up housing, etc.) 20 quilts, 37 pillows and cases, 24 bath towels, 25 pool towels, 4 brown blankets.

Tyler's Justice Center for Children in Stockton: 8 children quilts, 4 dolls.
