Pastor to be installed and congregational representative come forward

Address and Questions

And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Do not neglect the gift that is in you, which was given to you through prophecy with the laying on of hands by the council of elders. Put these things into practice, devote yourself to them, so that all may see your progress. Pay close attention to yourself and to your teaching; continue in these things, for in doing this you will save both yourself and your hearers.

P: Will you preach and teach in accordance with the holy scriptures and with the confessions of the Lutheran church? Will you carry out this ministry in harmony with the constitutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America?

In: I will, and I ask God to help me.

P: Will you be diligent in your study of the holy scriptures and faithful in your use of the means of grace?

In: I will, and I ask God to help me.

P: Trusting in God's care, will you love, serve, and pray for God's people, nourish them with the word and sacraments, and lead them by your own example in faithful service and holy living?

In: I will, and I ask God to help me.

P: Will you give faithful witness in the world, that God's love may be known in all that you do?

In: I will, and I ask God to help me.

P: Almighty God, who has given you the will to do these things, graciously give you the strength and compassion to perform them.

C: Amen.

P: People of God, will you receive Thomas as a messenger of Jesus Christ sent to serve all people with the gospel of hope and salvation? Will you regard Thomas as a servant of Christ and a steward of the mysteries of God?
