

## Highlights from Special Council Meeting on December 15<sup>th</sup>

- Church Council approved the contract for Rev. Art Stees to serve as the Interim Pastor at Good Shepherd beginning on Jan 1st 2016
- Church Council approved January 31st, 2016 as the date for the Annual Meeting.

### AGENDA HIGHLIGHTS from December 8, 2015

- Exit Interview with Pastor Miranda and Church Council facilitated by Assistant to the Bishop Rev. Denver Bitner
- First Reading of the proposed revisions to the Endowment Policy
- Chris Brinker, Property Committee Chair joined the Church Council meeting to share recommendations from the Property Team.
  - The Church Council approved the recommended Capital Campaign Project Scope as submitted
  - The Church Council approved up to \$1000 from the BMI Fund for the property committee to seek assistance with the capital campaign proposal from Julie Lee or another qualified professional.
  - The Church Council approved having the two recommended proposals from the Property Committee placed on the agenda for the Annual Meeting in order to be voted upon by the congregation:
- Resolution #1: "Be it resolved that the congregation of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church authorize the Congregation Council to develop the building renovation proposal shared in the congregation information meetings in July 2015 and January 2016; and furthermore to allow up to \$5000 to be spent, if needed, for the purpose of further proposal development, with the understanding that any decision to commence actual work on the building would be made by the congregation at a special meeting of the congregation."
- Resolution #2: "Be it resolved that the congregation of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church authorize a capital fund-raising campaign."
- The 2016 Budget recommendations from the Finance Committee were passed out. This was tabled for the January meeting.

## **HIGHLIGHTS from minutes from November 10, 2015**

- Memorial: The defibrillator has arrived. Waiting for the Red Cross to assist in location and training persons to operate it.
- Discussion of Endowment Policy recommendations, including using 4% as the guide for distributions. It was noted that one of the four propsed funds, the Enduring Gifts Fund, could go the general fund.
- Capital Campaign: Pastor Kurt Nordby has agreed to be a resource
- Charitable Giving from the Endowment Fund: The church council voted to send \$1000 to ELCA Disaster Relief\$1000 ELCA Disaster Relief, \$250 to Grace Place, \$500 to the After School Program/ Hang Out, \$500 to Mission Support/ Northern Illinois Synod, \$1,250 to the Lena Food Pantry, \$250 to the Lena Area Church Cooperative, \$500 to ELCA Global Missionary Sponsorship (Stubb Family), & \$500 to Lutheran Outdoor Ministries Center


