Dear friends and family,

I am very impressed with the abundance of support I received. The first week my dad, Chris Brinker, and friend Troy Keene joined me in service and did most of the construction. (That is not my strong suit to say the least) The second week my mom, Angie Brinker and friend, Alex Luchini picked up where we left off and worked on the cosmetics and planting of the garden. I would like to extend my most gracious and loving thank you to these four that donated their time, energy, and patience to Fraggle Rock's Community Garden, and to the people of Pine Ridge. You have made an impact on many lives. You all did great work. Thank you so much. I would also like to thank the people who made this project happen and helped the garden and I along every step of the way. Pinky and her crew at the OST Partnership for Housing welcomed us in as a new partner in the development of the Fraggle Rock community park. Pinky is a very wise, caring, driven woman and I cannot thank her enough. Also, a huge thank you to Pastor Kay for setting me up with Pinky and hosting us at the Retreat Center.

As a lot of you probably know Pine Ridge is a place of great despair, and deep oppression. It is very easy to see only the bad and the ugly, but if you look closely enough you can see beauty everywhere. The vastness of the landscape is breathtaking, and the beauty of the native culture is beyond words. Pine Ridge may be poor in dollars, but they are still rich in culture.

Throughout the two weeks, my team and I learned how much of a challenge it is to accomplish things in Indian Country. We faced many bumps along the road but we always came together and found a solution. What truly matters in the culture is whether or not you make connections and build relationships, and maybe not always accomplishing things as quickly. Although the garden was a success and will continue to sustain itself, the thing I am happiest about are the relationships I was able to build.

My plans for the future include returning to Pine Ridge, of course. I am hoping to return a few different timeS throughout the next year. My team and I plan on staying connected with the people and kids we met by writing letters and sending pictures. In February 2017 I will be traveling to Honduras through World Gospel Outreach on a medical mission trip. In college, I plan on majoring in Biology with an emphasis on pre-med and then entering into humanitarian work.

You have helped me find my purpose, happiness, and inner peace by supporting me on these trips to Pine Ridge. "The native culture of your land is a bridge back to the balance within yourself. Here you understand your place on this earth." [- Ainslie Roberts] You made this all possible. I am so grateful for you and your decision to support me and this project within the Pine Ridge community. Thank you from the bottom of my heart. Wopila Tanka! (Big Thanks)




