Jeffrey Clements elected bishop of



Northern Illinois Synod

CHICAGO – The Rev. H. Jeffrey Clements, Rockford, was elected June 18 to serve a six -year term as bishop of the Northern Illinois Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church

in America (ELCA). The election was held during the Synod Assembly June 16-18 at Centennial Hall at Augustana College in Rock Island, IL

Clements was elected on the fifth ballot with 278 votes to 181 votes for the Rev. Stacie R. Fidlar, pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church in Rock Island. "I have never yet served a call in this church that I would have anticipated or sought. Yet, each time the Holy Spirit has spoken through the church, I have been challenged and happy," said Clements. "The same is true today. I am honored and humbled to receive this call and will gladly serve the Northern Illinois Synod in a time of great transition in the church." Clements has served as assistant to the bishop of the Northern Illinois Synod since 2002. He was pastor of First Lutheran Church in Prophetstown, Ill., from 1990 to 2002. Clements earned a Bachelor of Arts in psychology from the University of Illinois at Chicago in 1977 and a Master of Divinity from Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minn., in 1983. Luther is one of the ELCA's eight seminaries. The Rev. Gary M. Wollersheim, current bishop of the Northern Illinois Synod, has served three six-year terms and will retire Aug. 31.

Clements will be installed as bishop Saturday, Sept. 24, at First Lutheran Church in Rockford.







COMING TO TERMS WITH A MERCIFUL GOD

WHEN GOD'S NOT FAIR

[Jonah] prayed to the Lord and said, "O Lord! Is not this what I said while I was still in my own country? That is why I fled to Tarshish at the beginning; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and ready to relent from punishing. And now, O Lord, please take my life from me, for it is better for me to die than to live" (Jonah 4:2-3).

Perhaps it's not fair to Jonah, but I thought of him the other day while talking to my four-year-old daughter, Natalie. In the zeal of cleaning out the family car, I threw away a small plastic toy, remnant of a long-ago kids' meal. Natalie had dropped the thing on the floor of the van and ignored it for weeks; yet when she caught a glimpse of it as it disappeared into the trash can, she was immediately incensed. How could I have thrown out her most precious possession without asking her permission?

My darling girl spent the rest of the day working through the stages of grief: anger ("You're the meanest mom ever!"), denial ("Are you sure it's gone? I want to go look in the car."), bargaining ("Can you buy me another one?"). Then—somewhere between depression and acceptance—Natalie hit the point of existential crisis. "It's not fair! I wish Jesus never made me!" she cried. Echoes of Jonah, ready to give up on life because of the unfairness of it all.


