The reception at Our Savior's will include a light lunch, thus making it possible for participants to return home immediately after its conclusion. Please plan on being on the buses at Our Savior's no later than 9:00 am to insure that all persons will be able to be transported to the Installation in a timely fashion. The prelude music begins at 9:30 a.m. Finally, I would ask that you please car pool as much as possible to ensure that adequate parking space will be available at Our Savior's.


