The First Commandment:
You are to have no other gods.
What is this? Answer: We are to fear, love, and trust God above all things.

(from The Small Catechism, the Ten Commandments) The Confirmation Class is learning the Small Catechism this year. Many of you who were confirmed in the Lutheran church probably have read the Small Catechism before. You may remember the formula: What is this? (or What does this mean?) Answer: We are to fear and love God (the commandments); or This is most certainly true (the Apostles' Creed). Do you know that Luther wrote the catechism because the pastors of his time knew very little about the Christian faith? Luther was shocked that pastors did not know the Ten Commandments, the Apostles' Creed, or even the Lord's Prayer. (If you are interested in Luther's bitter remarks, I encourage you to read the preface to the Small Catechism. He had a unique sense of humor.) The Small Catechism was first published in 1529, and it was meant to be used in households or churches to instruct children about the Christian faith. When I read the Small and Large Catechisms for confirmation class, I find them very interesting. I especially like Luther's explanations in The Lord's Prayer, which makes me assured of God's loving care for all God's children. Let's read from Luther:

The Seventh Petition "But deliver us from evil." What is this? Answer: We ask in this prayer, as in a summary that our Father in heaven may deliver us from all kinds of evil—affecting body or soul, property or reputation—and at last, when our final hour comes, may grant us a blessed end and take us by grace from this valley of tears to himself in heaven.

Luther states that we ask these petitions so that we see and experience God's saving activity among ourselves. Reading the catechism helps me to deepen my understanding of God and God's grace.

Are you interested in reading the catechism? There are copies in the church and you can also find it online. Lutherans are celebrating 500 years of the Reformation movement this year. This year will be a great time to read Luther's writings and deepen our relationships with God. May God's grace warm our hearts today. Pr. Miho

Celebrate Our Church Anniversary **History of Our Church**

Following the Blackhawk War of 1832 the Northern most tier of Illinois counties were considered safe for white settlement. Settlers flocked in droves as shown by the 1840 and 1850 census which shows a 100% increase in population in northern Illinois during this decade.

The great majority of these settlers were of German heritage, however there were two distinct groups one being first generation immigrates coming directly from Germany and a second being of second and third generation immigrants moving west from New York and Pennsylvania where their parents and grandparents had settled years before.

In 1848 Reverend Scherer an Itinerant State Missionary for the Illinois Lutheran Synod came to Stephenson County and reported back to Synod that there were at least 100 settlers of the Lutheran faith residing in the county.

In 1850, at the urging of his Father-in-law, Samuel Grossman, Reverend George J. Donmeyer came to Stephenson County from Pennsylvania as his in-laws had some five years earlier. On arrival Rev. Donmeyer found 2 preaching stations in the county. However, by the Illinois Synod meeting of 1851 he had organized 5 congregations. In 1856 Reverend Donmeyer organized two more congregations one in Buena Vista with 18 members and another in Lena with 31 members. The congregation in Lena met in various houses as well as the old stone school at the corner of Lena and Franklin Streets.

On November 6, 1850 Rev. El Fair resigned his Berlin parish of Alleghany Synod of Pennsylvania and journeyed west to Lena, Illinois. The Pennsylvania Synod had reported the fields are ripe for harvest and the laborers are few. Reverend Fair served the Lena congregation in late 1856 and early 1857 while Rev. Donmeyer was preaching at his other congregations.

Reverend Donmeyer favored worship services in the original German language and old traditions while Reverend Fair favored services in the English language with emphasis on revivals.

These two philosophies caused a division in the Lena congregation with the first generation immigrants favoring the German services of Rev. Donmeyer while the second and third generation immigrants preferred the English language and revival services of Rev. Fair. And so on March 14, 1857 Amity Lutheran church of Lena was chartered by Reverend Eli Fair while on the very same day Reverend George J. Donmeyer chartered the German Evangelical Lutheran Immanuel congregation of Lena.

With both congregations being small and of limited means the two congregations agreed to build one house of worship to be shared by the two congregations. The proposed building was to be 35 feet by 50 feet with a basement and surmounted by a cupola or dome on the corner of Mason and Washington Streets.

Both congregations were received in the Northern Illinois Synod of the Lutheran church at their 1857 meeting.

Constructions of the proposed church building was completed in 1859 with dedication that autumn. By 1884 Amity was the third largest congregation in the Northern Illinois Synod and Immanuel was the fourth largest.

The church windows in the sanctuary are decorated for Epiphany. The concept for this is taken off the definition or the word Epiphany. The Cambridge Dictionary defines Epiphany as "1. a Christian Holiday in January (traditionally January 6 in Western Christianity) that celebrates the revelation of the baby Jesus to the world." Other

definitions include "2. a moment when you suddenly feel that you understand, or suddenly become conscious of, something that is very important to you." And "3. a powerful religious experience."

Each window happens to have a Bible in it with the candles. Each Bible is turned to a different verse that deals with the enlightenment of the Christian faith through an epiphany with Christ. (Find the Bible passage in the Sanctuary)
