But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said." (Matthew 28:5-6)

On April 14 and 16 in 2016, my hometown was hit by separate, powerful earthquakes. I happened to be home and experienced the shaking of the ground. Both earthquakes happened at night. Our family has accumulated a lot of stuff over the years, especially books which my father loves. Books were stacked in the book shelves, hallways, and in any available storage spaces in our house. When the magnitude 7.3 quake hit on the 16<sup>th</sup>, we were sleeping. Alarmed by the great shaking I woke up and grabbed my shoes and emergency backpack which I prepared after the first earthquake. Fortunately my room door was open, and I walked on the piles of encyclopedias in the hallway to find the way out. My father shouted from downstairs for my sister and me to flee from the house immediately.

At that time we had two cats. One was an 8 year old mature cat who liked to catch birds and lizards. The other cat was a young one who sometimes had trouble returning from neighborhood explorations. The younger one was my father's favorite, and she slept on my father's blanket. When the earthquake happened, we had no idea where they were. Experiencing the constant aftershocks, we could not look for them but had to evacuate. My father expressed that the cats were probably dead under piles of books.

We returned to our house two days later and began picking up the mess. Moving one book at the time, we did not find the cats. The next day my sister exclaimed that our older cat came back. I called her name, and it was our cat. A few hours later, the younger cat came back. Our family was overjoyed. We thought they were dead, but they were alive and came back to our house.

In the Gospel of Matthew there was a great earthquake which rolled back the stone that covered the entrance to Jesus' tomb. The women who went to tomb must have been frightened by both the great earthquake and encountering a messenger of God wearing dazzling clothing. Nevertheless, they became the first witnesses of the resurrection of Jesus. With fear and great joy they ran to tell the other disciples about the good news-Jesus overcame death and was resurrected. May the joy of Easter be with you. Pr. Miho




