When Jesus fed 5000 people, his disciples were worried. They only had 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish, and they thought there was not enough food to feed everyone. Jesus was calm He blessed the food, broke the bread, and distributed the food to the people. To their surprise, all were filled and there were 12 baskets full of leftovers. People were satisfied physically and spiritually

Despite our worries, God provides just enough amount for us. I thank our youth, our chefs, and those who were a part of the Lenten evening services. And I thank God for giving me what I need everyday.

Prayer is essential for our lives. Through prayer we communicate with God. We lift up our joys and concerns to God. At Good Shepherd, we have several prayer opportunities. One is the Prayer Chain. If you have specific prayer requests (ex. surgery, an accident, one is dying), you may call the church office or Vivian Hesselbacher to start the prayer chain. The members of the prayer chain will pray individually and then pass the prayer on to the next person in the chain. Another prayer opportunity is to add a prayer to the prayers of intercession at Sunday worship. You may call the church or write down your prayer request on the prayer request sheet in the sanctuary. We usually keep the prayer petition for four weeks unless the office receives a request to keep the prayer on the list for another four weeks or to remove the prayer from the list.

Your prayer requests can be submitted in various ways. You may give us names (first name only or first and last names of the person) or you may ask for a general prayer (such as praying for those who are going through chemotherapy). If you would like to give a name, please ask the person for permission; sometimes people do not want their names to be listed. Praying is a vital part of being disciples of Jesus. As the Bible says, "Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints." (Ephesians 6:18) Let us grow in the Spirit through prayer.

Highlights from April Council Meetings

- Colton Brinker has prepared a list of items requested to support the May Mission Trip to Pine Ridge. Five youth will attend. The list will be posted in various areas.
- Colton is part of the youth mission trip, but he will extend his stay at Pine Ridge for an additional 10 weeks beyond the regular trip. During that time he will act as guest host and will be responsible for various tasks in the absence of the full time host. Brinker asked the Council for a donation to help cover his expenses, which will include gas, for the 10-week stay.
- Prior to the close of the meeting, the Council approved a donation of \$200 to be drawn from the Current Account. Troy Keene made the motion to approve the donation and Coralyn Hudik seconded. All approved.
- On behalf of the Property Committee, Chris Brinker presented a proposal from Quinn Construction for the roof project over the sanctuary. The \$22,873.00 bid includes labor and material for 29-gauge white steel roof with exposed fasteners. This material will match the new roof over the classroom section. Existing shingles will not be removed. Two other local construction companies chose not to bid the project. A 50% down payment will be required before materials can be ordered and to secure the spot with Quinn Construction. The work is expected to take 2-3 weeks to complete.
- Pastor Miho presented her report. The Pine Ridge Mission Trip will be May 23–28. The NW Conference Pre-Assembly meeting will be April 27 at St. John's, Pearl City, and the Youth Assembly will be June 15-16.
- The Learning Committee Report highlighted April and May events. The last day of Sunday School will be May 7. Teacher Recognition will be May 14 and a reception will follow
- Vacation Bible School is set for July 17-20 to be shared by Lena Methodist Church and Beloved Church.
- The Men's Group has removed pews from the choir loft and they hope to relocate the chimes there.
- Tim Gordon said Mediacom sent a \$50 gift card for employing their services. Troy Doubler made the motion to apply the money toward the Anniversary celebration Troy Keene seconded. All approved
- Wayne Kurth was nominated as the male delegate to the Synod Assembly. Troy Doubler moved to accept the nomination. Coralyn Hudik seconded and the motion was approved


