What has shaped who you are today? What did you inherit from your parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, or great grandparents? What would you like to pass on to your children as your legacy? What is your legacy as children of God?

I have been reading the histories of Good Shepherd, Immanuel, and Amity. The stories of our past are unique. Some stories are funny, and some stories are heartbreaking. There are lessons to learn, and there are stories to tell. Good Shepherd has been sharing the love of God in Lena for 160 years. We are generous and compassionate people of God who love and care for each other. I wonder what we, as people who were saved by the grace of God, would like to pass on to future generations.

When Jesus was heading to the cross, he gave a new commandment to his disciples as his legacy. Jesus commanded them to love one another because through their acts of love, he declared that "everyone will know that you are my disciples." To carry the legacy of Jesus is to love one another and serve one another. We love and care for each other through our ministries including our commitments at the food pantry, doing God's Work Our Hands service projects, making LWR quilts, visiting and singing at nursing homes, and making and sending out birthday cards. Through our acts of love, everyone may know that we are followers of Christ. I thank you for your prayers and willingness to share your love to others. I thank you for your faithfulness to Christ. I pray that the Holy Spirit continues to stir us.

## THE PASTOR'S MESSAGE

We have named our congreation, "Good Shepherd, "and thus have chosen to affix our name as well as our lives on the great, Shepherd of God, Jesus Christ of Nazareth. Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep. For this reason the Father I oves me, because I lay down my life, that I may take it again. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again; this charge I have received from my Father."

Jesus is the Good Shepherd, first, because he owns the sheep. He owns you and me. St. John tells us, "In the beginning was Jesus, and Jesus was with God, and Jesus was God. Jesus was in the beginning with God: All things were made through Him, and without Him was not anything made that was made." Jesus was present at the creation and so created the stars and the moon, the mountains and the trees, the flowers and the bees, the man and the woman. As we are part of His creation we are His possession – His sheep.



Secondly, Jesus is the Shepherd because he knows all His sheep. A good shepherd knows his sheep: when they are hungry; when they are fitted and sick; when they are likely to stray from the fold; when they are in trouble and in need of help. Jesus knows our every need and is a very present help in trouble. He knows our name, what we do, how we treat others, how we feel, and what we think and experience in the very depths of our being.

Thirdly, Jesus is our Shepherd because he feeds His sheep. A good shepherd always knows: where to find food for his sheep; where to find water for drink and green pastures for rest and quiet. Jesus, who created us and the world, is still with us providing for our every need. Jesus is not like the carpenter who builds a house, sells it, and then leaves it to itself. Jesus is the Good Shepherd who owns us through creation and who still provides for us: as he causes the rain to fall upon the just and the unjust; as He sends His sunshine to all people; as He gives healing to sick bodies and comfort to the distressed.

Fourth, we know Jesus is the Good Shepherd because He leads His sheep. A good shepherd does not take his sheep out to a hill side and say, "Now graze, have your fill and then find your way back home." No, Jesus gives us life and health and abilities and says, "Use what you have been given in joy, believe on me as your Shepherd, follow me and I will lead you on the right path. The path will be rough and rocky at times but it will lead to my Father's Kingdom." Jesus leads all who will follow and grants strength for the journey.

Fifth, the good shepherd will give up his life for the sheep. We are as the fallen sheep who are separated from the shepherd because we have run away in sin and rebellion through our own greed and envy. We have turned against our Creator and can see him not. We are lost and fallen into the bottomless pit of despair. We cannot make our way back to the fold by and of ourselves. Our Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ, gives up His life on the Cross of Calvary so that we can be freed from despair and sin and be forgiven before God. He gives Himself to death so that we may have life. This is our Good Shepherd, - Jesus Christ, and we say we are part of His Body as we are members one of another in this congregation. Are we not then as members of the body of Christ to be Good Shepherds to fellow souls in our world?

# WE COME FROM AMITY EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH



Stephenson County was the last county in Illinois to be sertled, waiting until after the close of the Blackhawk War of 1832 for the influx of settlers. The first came largely from New York, Ohia and Pennsylvania, followed closely by the large German immigration. These two groups of seople, many Lutherans among them, provide the background for organizing two Lutheran Churches in Lena on the 14th of March, 1857.

Rev. Eli Fair came to Lena in the Spring of 1856 in a typical immigrant wagon, settling on a farm one and a half miles Northwest of Lena. He began preaching and farming to pay expenses. He was the spiritual father of Amity, organizing it with 27 charter members.

Because the English speaking and German speaking people could not agree on the language and methods of evangelism Immanuel Church was organized by Rev. George J. Donmeyer, who had settled in Buena Vista in 1850. He had seven preaching stations in the county, two of which developed into the congregations of Salem (Cross Roads) and Unity. These churches were ofted served by pastors from Amity.


On the organization day the two congregations agreed to build a "house 35  $\times$  50 feet, with basement story surmounted by a cupola or dome." The two congregations united in erection of the church building, and used it jointly for about eleven years.

During the 109 years 22 pastors served Amity. In this period several major improvements were made to the church building. In 1912, during the pastorate of Rev. Edward Derr, extensive remodeling resulted in the sanctuary we now use.

While Rev. Armin Weng was pastor, it became evident that more church school room was needed and plans were drawn. During the pastorate of Rev. Richard A. Bailey the parish education unit was built and dedicated September 13, 1964.

In 1965 it became clearly evident that union of the two original Lutheran Congregations in Lena would be desirable. Steps bringing the dissolution of Amity and Immanuel congregations resulted in the formation of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church on February 27, 1966, and Rev. Richard Bailey was appointed Vice-Pastor.

# WE COME FROM IMMANUEL'S EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH



The early history of Immanuel's Lutheran Church is closely linked to that of the villiage of Lena. In 1854 when the railroad was built, a number of German immigrants settled near Lena. The Rev. George Donmeyer, who had been sent from Pennsylvania in 1850 as a missionary to the Lutherans in Stephenson County, served the spiritual needs of those early settlers. Services were held in various homes and in the old stone village school located at the corner of Lena and Franklin streets.

However, those God – fearing people desired to organize a church, and on March 14, 1857, they organized a congregation under the name of "German Evangelical Lutheran Immanuel Congregation of Lena Illinois."

On that same day Amity Lutheran Church was also organized. Both congregations were small and poor, and so they built their first church together, and used it alternately for about elevn years. As Immanuel's congregation grew stronger, its members decided to build a church for themselves, Amity's congregation paid Immanuel's congregation \$1000.00, which was used, along with donations of the memgers, to build the present Immanuel's church. The church was completed and dedicated on 1869.

Two sons of the congregation became ministers: The Rev. William Heidenreich


