As much as I try to be prepared, however, I frequently encounter unpredicted moments like a car pulling over and a stranger or a familiar face offering me a ride, receiving a phone call that one of our members is in the hospital, or a youth offering a prayer which speaks deeply to my heart. These are some examples of finding myself thrown into God's holy chaos. Somehow God works through seemingly catastrophic and disorienting moments. I do not wish that we experience disasters or tragedies, but the fact is that bad things happen to us. We may be in an accident or may be diagnosed with cancer or dementia. We may encounter financial challenges or may face fear of losing loved ones. We may struggle with our faith in God. We know that God will never abandon God's people, but sometimes God seems quiet or rather silent.

When God's Spirit came down on Pentecost, people were experiencing uncertainties. Jesus had gone into heaven, and the small number of disciples remained. It seemed that the Jesus movement was dwindling. Yet God kept God's promises. God poured out the Holy Spirit, and more people witnessed God's mighty acts. The Pentecost story is also our story. In our lives we, too, witness God's Spirit poured over our neighbors, care providers, friends, children, strangers, and even onto our pets. Their presence, warm hands, phone calls, and text messages remind us of God's unfailing love. It's amazing how God works. I pray for you that you may taste God's holy encounters. Pr. Miho



#### **Highlights from April Council Meetings**

- Treasurer Jay Andrews presented the March report and it was approved. The electric bill was \$222.64 and the gas bill was \$668.60. Permission to pay the \$600 installment to the Lena Food Pantry from the Lucille Baker Account was given.
- Pastor Miho presented her March report which was accepted by all. Highlighted was the May 10 Baccalaureate service at Salem United Church of Christ and the LOMC Memorial al Day Work Weekend May 25 – 28.
- In Committee Reports, Denny Luke advised that all three of the church pianos have been tuned; Dodd's Park has been reserved for the first Sunday in August for the annual outdoor worship service; Special music will be provided the fifth Sunday of the month when it occurs, this first occasion is in April; and the newly created cling-ons will be available for purchase by parishioners late in May
- Kristy Patterson said three local churches will once again work together for Vacation Bible School and OWL Night, an overnight lock-in for youth, is set for May 18-19. More adult volunteers are needed.
- Troy Doubler announced that one of the burners in the boiler is not working and some portions of the office and classroom areas are without heat. Repairs will be sought.
- Scholarship applications for this year's graduates are now being accepted. The first Cook Out Sunday organized by the Men's Group is set for June 17.
- In another matter, Lisa Wienand was nominated as additional designee on the Special Funds Account. .
- New church secretary Betty Allen was officially hired per a March motion. She has been
  in training with outgoing secretary Darlene Barr. Barr has given seven years of service to
  Good Shepherd. An official recognition for her is planned for a future date.
- Anna Patterson was nominated as the Youth Delegate for Synod Assembly to be held June 15 16.
- Denny Luke said Life Touch will be at the church June 21 23 taking photos for a new
  pictorial directory. Appointment sign-up sheets will be available closer to the time of the
  event. The directory comes at no cost to the church and every member having their photo
  taken will receive an 8 by 10 portrait as well as a directory at no cost.
- Danica Balbach, member who recently returned from a mission trip to Haiti, presented
  the gift of a painting symbolic of the country to Good Shepherd. Balbach was appreciative of the support she had received from the congregation as well as her upbringing in
  the church
- In another matter, Council heard the need for quilting supplies from Troy Doubler. The Piece Corps has created more than 15,000 quilts for countries worldwide since its inception. A motion was made by Kristy Patterson to purchase quilting supplies with money from the Lucille Baker Endowment Fund. The check for \$2,000 for 2018 will be made payable to Good Shepherd Lutheran Church to establish the Piece Corp Account.






