Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and prosper for us the work of our hands—O prosper the work of our hands! (Psalm 90:17)

Sisters and brothers of Good Shepherd, it is September—Quilt Sunday is coming. This year we will celebrate Quilt Sunday on September 30 (Make sure to mark your calendar!). During worship we will give thanks for the hands of quilters and bless the quilts which will become physical messengers of God's grace to the world. As I write this article, the Piece Corps has made 533 quilts of love since last October, and I am sure the quilters will make more by Quilt Sunday.

The Piece Corps Quilters gather every Wednesday (including July 4 this year) from 8 am to 11 am or so depending on good timing to quit working. The quilters are dedicated, hard workers. Through rain or shine or snow, they gather at the Fellowship Hall and make beautiful quilts. Many of you have heard about how the Piece Corps Quilters started when Joyce received a call to make quilts for Lutheran World Relief. Since 1974 Good Shepherd has created 15,418 quilts of comfort and love. That's quite an accomplishment, and I am very proud of our quilting ministry.

Do you know that it takes a village to make one quilt? I've been watching many hands involved in quilt making. For instance, some cut the squares, others sort out the squares, some iron the cloths for cutting, some tear off the hems of cloths, and others sew together the squares. Some cut battings, some tie the quilts, some pin the corners, some sew the corners together and pile the quilts up on chairs, and some box them. I was talking to a quilter the other day that she told me that the Piece Corps has been blessed with materials; they have always had an abundance of materials. She is right. I've witnessed our members and other people in community bringing bags and boxes full of materials for quilts. All the hands and feet and wheels and mouths (Please tell others about our Piece Corps ministry!) make it possible to share God's abundant grace with others.

When I touch and bless each quilt, I think of the kingdom of God because God's people come together to share the love of God, and each quilt is a reminder of God's warmth and presence. I encourage you to be a part of this blessing, too.
