




The SHEPHERD'S VOICE May 2019

Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. (John 21:4)

What is the color of Easter for you? Light green? Yellow? White? Or pink? Easter comes in Spring, and for me as a southerner, the Easter season is a time of flowers blooming, cherry blossoms, tulips, pansies, ..., you name it. My memories of Easter season (I'll remind you that the Easter season is from Easter Sunday until Pentecost, which is 50 days of celebration!) are filled with newness and excitement, young leaves, sunshine, and strawberries.

But three years ago I noticed that Easter stories in the Bible take place in dim light. Women went to the tomb on Easter Sunday when it was still dark. Cleopas and his friend walked with Jesus and when it was getting dark, they entered the inn, Jesus broke bread, their eyes were opened, and they ran back to Jerusalem in darkness. Thomas and the other disciples were inside a house behind locked doors when Jesus appeared and showed them his scars. When Jesus stood on the beach, it was daybreak, not broad daylight.

I felt odd when I noticed the darkness in Easter stories because I always believed that Easter was about life, full of energy and joy. I pondered and puzzled about this until I realized that Easter stories are stories of people who are grieving their loss—the loss of hope, purpose, their friends, their community, and their life. No wonder the stories occurred in early in the morning, inside a house, or in the evening. Followers of Jesus were living day by day, trying to cope with their grief.

I like the sun's shining and bright light for my walks; yet in darkness and dim light we meet the risen Jesus. During Lent we had evening services on Wednesdays. We had small groups, sitting together at one or two tables illuminated with candlelight. For those of us who are accustomed to electric lighting, the candle light's were tiny and dim. One evening we were trying to look at a picture in the devotion book. It was a picture of a shadow of a cross on a brick wall. I asked what we saw in the picture assuming everyone would talk about the shadow of the cross. One of our group said, "I see a person praying." Everyone at the table tried to figure out where we could see a person praying in the picture with the dim candle light's. I could not find the figure, and the person next to me traced the image—it really was like an image of a person praying similar to Jesus in the familiar Gethsemane painting. On Sunday one of our members told me that she went home and told her family about the picture. She opened up the devotion book to show the picture of the person praying to her family, but they could not find that image. The praying person appeared only under dim light.

The risen Lord appears to his disciples when they were in despair. In their grief many of them could not recognize Jesus. Jesus came in the midst of their darkness, talked to them, ate with them, listened to their struggles, and was simply present with them. I wonder if that is what new life in Christ means.



Celebrating Mothers May 9, 1914,

Anna Jarvis of Philadelphia wanted to remember her own mother along with all mothers. Anna's mother had been very active in working to improve the health of people in her community. Jarvis's mother also organized a Mother's Friendship event in her community to bring confederate and union soldiers together for a peaceful celebration. Many other women such as Julia Ward Howe, Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Elizabeth Smith also fought for peace and encouraged mothers to speak out. Anna Jarvis convinced her mother's church to celebrate Mother's Day on the anniversary of her mother's death, and campaigned for a national day honoring mothers. Because of Jarvis's hard work, Woodrow Wilson chose that date for the national holiday.








New Sound System Installation for the new sound system will begin after the Easter Holiday.

Highlights from April Council Meetings

- Jay Andrews presented the March Treasurer's Report which included the gas bill of \$817.62 and electric bill of \$204.16. K. Patterson made the motion to approve and Don Wienand made the second. All agreed.
- B. Raymer moved to pay the first installment of the Lena Food Pantry building rent drawing \$600 from the Lucille Baker Endowment Fund. C. Hudik made the second and Council fully approved. Good Shepherd's yearly commitment is \$1200.
- Pastor Miho gave her monthly report which included Holy Week schedules. She also reflected on how personal invitations have made a difference in welcoming others to the church.
- Pastor highlighted the recent Hymn Sing at Lena Living Center which was well-attended, plus future May events including Devotion and Desserts at the Friendship Center May 16; Teacher Recognition Sunday May 19; Sunday service at Lena Living Center May 19 and the Youth OWL Night May 31 June 1.
 C. Hudik made the motion to approve Pastor's Report and K. Patterson made the second. Council agreed.
- C. Hudik, on behalf of the Stewardship Committee, said the group has been discussing "Reflection on a "Spiritual Timeline" in addition to its regular activities.
- K. Patterson, Learning Committee, spoke on several topics. She advised the recent Youth Sunday was well-received; noted Confirmation Class has begun; said youth will be involved in Easter breakfast preparation and serving the meal; and advised the next meeting for Vacation Bible School is set for May 7. The event will once again include three local churches.
- Pastor mentioned the Mobile Food Pantry will be at the Lena pantry April 23 and Good Shepherd is scheduled to volunteer at the pantry the fourth Saturday of the month.
- Denny Luke said the Property Committee met with Steve Buss to discuss installation of the sound system. Work will not begin until after Easter so the sanctuary is not disrupted during the season. Volunteers will be asked to help evenings when work begins. Luke also said a new eternal light has been received as part of the memorials already received. It will be installed in the near future.
- Tim Gordon suggested the committee look into replacement of the curb in the front of the church with potential addition to the memorial list. He was asked to gather bids.
- D. Luke said applications for college scholarships are due by the end of April. Applications will be reviewed and will need approval from the Council.
- T. Gordon said he continues to work on Facebook entries and has expanded posts to include area wide concerns and events.
- D. Luke said the first Confirmation Reunion Sunday with returning Pastor David Raben was well-received. Five confirmands under Raben's tenure plus other friends and families attended the service. Luke said he also spoke with Pastor Raben who said he enjoyed greeting friends of Good Shepherd at the church again.

Council Meeting Minuets continued:

- T. Gordon, Men's Ministry, said the group recently had a work day at the home of a parishioner and reorganized the boiler room.
- K. Patterson moved to accept the committee reports and T. Gordon made the second. Council fully approved.
- In other business, Council learned a male delegate is still needed for the Northern Illinois Synod Assembly in June. Council unanimously approved a motion by K. Patterson to allow Rock River Blood Drive to use the Fellowship hall for a blood drive at a future date. The second was made by C. Hudik.
- In future business, Council learned more worship volunteers are needed and discussion is continuing on obtaining armed chairs for fellowship hall.
- K. Patterson discussed a pilot program that is being offered by Mitek, Winslow, to provide matching funds for a select number of local groups. Good Shepherd Youth Group has been accepted for the spring program which will span three months, April, May and June. Under the program Mitek will match up to \$1,000 in funds raised by the group. C. Hudik made a motion to accept this proposal and B. Raymer seconded. Council fully approved. Patterson said donations collected for the Easter breakfast can be applied toward this amount.
- Motion to adjourn was made by K. Patterson with second by B. Raymer. All approved and the meeting closed with the recital of The Lord's Prayer.


