

The SHEPHERD'S VOICE June 2019

When the day of Pentecost had come, ...[all] of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. (Acts 2:1, 4)

Good Friday, Holy Saturday, Easter, repeat... This is what I feel these days. Some days are gloomy, murky and tiring (like the weather for most of this winter/spring), and on other days I feel good, energetic, thankful for everything, and nice to people. I am aware that God created some people with never-ending cheerfulness who are always smiling even in tough times, and I appreciate that. But encountering life's ups and downs, I have learned to accept that there are good days and bad days; it is true that "[for] everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." (Ecclesiastes 3:10)

One day I was talking with one of our members who is a caregiver. She expressed that she had a pretty good day the day before, but that this day she felt like she was back to Good Friday: tired, beaten down, and depressed. The past couple days were very stressful for her but Easter people showed up and helped her out. Listening to her stories I pondered that maybe our lives are a going back and forth between Good Friday and Easter, and some days we are in the in-between time of Holy Saturday. We have days when nothing seems to work out, we're overwhelmed with tasks, and we're exhausted. All we want to do is close our eyes and go away somewhere like the disciples on Good Friday. We also have days when we sit down, maybe with a cup of coffee, trying to think through choices and potential consequences. Some days are just wonderful, sunny, uplifting, and full of joys and laughter. I've learned to realize that Easter joys do not last forever. We forget the sweet taste of bread and wine, and life's challenges can easily turn our focus into ourselves. God's love is unconditional and never ending, but we swing back and forth between hope and despair. That's who we are, and that's what life is like for me.

That's why I like the Pentecost story. All of the sudden, God's Spirit came down and breathed through all God's people. There were no warnings or preparation, it just happened. God breaks into our lives by surprise! That's the way I usually experience God. Whenever I feel stuck, God provides. God brings Easter people (or you may call them God's angels) in the midst of my worries and uncertainties. God over and over again sends God's spirit to remind us that God loves us, cares for us, provides for all our needs, and revives our hopes in our hearts. The story of Pentecost reminds us of God's surprising presence. I pray that the Spirit of God blows into your heart and revive you over and over again.

Lutheran Social Services of Illinois

Lutheran Social Services of Illinois (LSSI) has been serving Illinois since 1867, LSSI is a nonprofit social service organization of the three Illinois synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). LSSI is the largest statewide social service provider, serving almost 50,000 people across Illinois last year. The organization provides critical programs for the state's most vulnerable residents including foster care, early childhood development, mental health services, alcohol and drug treatment, home care for seniors, affordable senior housing, residential programs for people with developmental disabilities, and programs that help formerly incarcerated individuals integrate back into society.

Children's Community Services

LSSI Foster Care Services provide placement and case management for children who have been removed from their birth families due to abuse and/or neglect. LSSI provides training, licensing, and services for foster families. LSSI collaborates with birth parents to reunite children with their birth families whenever possible. When reunification with birth families is not possible, children may achieve permanency through adoption. 2430 children were served through Foster Care placements, with 534 children achieving permanency, meaning they were reunited with their birth families or adopted. LSSI is one of the largest providers of foster care in the state.
