The SHEPHERD'S VOICE August 2019

For if you keep silence at such a time as this, relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another quarter, but you and your father's family will perish. Who knows? Perhaps you have come to royal dignity for just such a time as this. (Esther 4:14)

I took a vacation and went to New Glarus, WI. It was very interesting. Following advice from members and staff, my husband and I stopped by the bakery and munched on good bread and pastry, saw Polish pottery (They were beautiful.), sampled a variety of fudge, and explored "America's Little Switzerland." My favorite place was the Swiss Historical Museum and Village. At the museum they narrated the story of New Glarus accompanied by zippy polka-like music, and the stories were hilarious. The original settlers were from Glarus canton in Switzerland. Glarus was located in a valley surrounded by mountains, and its main industry was textiles. However, by the early 19th century manual labor was taken over by machines and industrialization. Losing their jobs in Glarus, they sought out hope in the United States. The first immigrants arrived in 1845, and searched for land in Illinois, Iowa, and Missouri; however, all the lands were already taken by other immigrants. Then, they purchased land at the current location of New Glarus because it was inexpensive. The immigrants first planted wheat, but that did not work well; so they switched to the dairy industry. They were having an abundance of milk, so they began making cheeses (I also learned the cheese making process at the museum.). Their cheese became well-known, and the train helped their cheese spread out to other markets. Then, the evaporated milk industry came in and took over the cheese factories. PET, the evaporated milk manufacturer did not stay long, closed the New Glarus factory, and moved to other towns. Facing another economic crisis, the German Swiss immigrants in New Glarus developed their town as tourist town. They knew who they were. They fully embraced their Deutsche-Swiss heritage. And they lived through all these challenging times with creativity and humor. I am impressed with their resilience, and their resilience emerged from their root as German-Swiss.

The book of Esther is an interesting book in the Bible. If you have a chance, I encourage you to read it through. It is only 10 chapters. The book of Esther is a story about how an orphan named Esther became a queen and saved the Jewish people. God's people went through huge ups and downs in their history—wandering through the wilderness for 40 years, establishing a kingdom, going into exile, returning to the promised land, re-building the country, facing attempted persecutions, and on and on. I wonder how many times God's people pondered "for such a time as this" and found God's resilience to care for them. God quietly remind them that they were God's chosen people and God would not abandon them but walks with their ups and downs. They were God's children, and God was with them in the wilderness and in the foreign land. Whether your roots are German or Swiss or Norwegian or Scottish or Swedish or Polish, our roots lie on our identity as a beloved child of God. Like the German-Swiss and Israelites, we go through ups and downs and curves. Someday feels terrific, and the other day feels exhausted and beaten. Life is full of "adventures." Sometimes I even wonder, where is God in all of this? Yet the stories of God's people remind me that God always walks with us. God is resilient. I find hope in there. I pray that God breathes through our hearts to remind us of the persistent love of God in our days. Pr. Miho *The June and July/August issues of Gather magazine features the book of

Slow Cooker BBQ

3 lb. stew meat
1 onion, chopped
1 green pepper, chopped
1-6 oz can tomato paste

1/2 cup brown sugar
1/4 cup cider vinegar
Salt and pepper to taste
2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce



Combine all ingredients in slow cooker. Mix well. Cook on LOW for 8-10 hours. Mix again to shred meat, serve on buns.


