I hear a lot of people's amazement and complements on our quilt ministry. Our quilts are pretty and comfortable. They bring smiles and joys to people. When I talked to this year's Fall Festival Quilt Raffle winners, they were so excited. I gradually realize that these quilts are not just blankets to keep us warm but they are the loving presence of God. As Rene said on the Quilt Sunday that each quilt is our prayers for all God's children.

You know, we are doing God's ministry. Our quilts reach out to God's people who are hurt and grieving. Thank you. Thank you for all you do to share the love of God to the world. I am so proud of our Piece Corps Quilting Group's accomplishment every year. Thank you for all you do for God's people. And keep up good work! Pr. Miho

A life-changing experience



ay Ressel, an ELCA pastor and director of Lutheran Lakota Shared Ministries. stresses that a pillar of her work in Jesus' name is to challenge people's beliefs about Native Americans and to "hold people accountable for how they engage in ministry."

*My job is to push you out of your comfort zone so you come to a different way of knowing the Lakota people," said Ressel, who is not Native American.


Headquartered on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation and funded in part by Mission Support from the South Dakota Synod and the churchwide organization, Lutheran Lakota Shared Ministries serves a geographic area that, at 3,500 square miles, is larger than Rhode Island and Delaware combined.

In 2000, Lutheran Lakota Shared Ministries opened a retreat center to house visiting teens who came to do missionary projects on the reservation.

"It was very appropriate in that time, but we knew we could do better," Ressel said. "Our focus now is on learning and listening to people's stories, getting to know one another, sharing time together, sharing meals. ... After we develop relationships, we find ways to work together."

The ministry still offers what Ressel refers to as "threshold ministries," with household items diapers, sandwiches, hygiene kits, blankets -- passed out the door to those in need.

In addition, there's the Lutheran/Lakota Job Corps. which employs about a dozen community members



in numerous roles. Staffers work with visitors who have come to the reservation to lend a hand and, more importantly, to gain a new perspective. This cultural-immersion ministry receives a variety of groups annually

Tammy Jacobi did a 10-day immersion in January 2018 as part of her studies at Wartburg Theological Seminary. The experience brought her face-to-face with her own privilege, which she found humbling.

"Given what we take for granted as daughters, mothers, wives living in western Christianity, the immersion was eye-opening," Jacobi said. "[It] was a life-changing experience. Everyone had a lesson to teach, a story to tell."



Come and Get it... FLU SHOTS

On Monday, October 14th, from 12:00pm (noon) until 3:00pm, FHN will offer flu shots at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Fellowship Hall. The cost of the High Dose shot this



year will be \$62.00 for persons over 65 if not covered by Medicare Part B or Medicare Replacement Plan accepted by FHN. Persons under 65 will be given the Quadrivalent vaccine with an out of pocket cost of \$28.00. No insurance plan claims can be processed other than Medicare Part B or Medicare Replacement Plan.

Because so many participants are confused by the Medicare Replacement Cards versus Medicare Card, our Central Business office has requested that we make a copy of all available medical cards so that the appropriated charges can be made and third party payer identified at all locations possible. A picture ID will also be requested and copied. Medicaid restrictions preclude our acceptance of Medicaid at your location.

Highlights from October Council Meetings

- The Secretary's Report was reviewed and approved with a motion from T. Gordon and second by K. Patterson.
- J. Andrews presented the treasurer's report which included an August electric bill of \$189.67 and gas bill of \$133.27. A motion made by K. Patterson received a second by B. Raymer and Council fully approved the report.
- Pastor Miho reviewed past and future activities and highlighted: Four examples of our church's ministries; Volunteering at the Le-Win Staff Appreciation Picnic; taking part in Lena Lions Fall Festival; Praying, visiting, singing, making quilts; and cheering and caring at youth events.
- Pastor also pointed out the FHN Flu shot event will be held at the church Oct. 14 as part of the Parkinson's Support Group gathering.
 Go & Cheer is set for Oct. 17 at the high school volleyball game at Pearl City. Pastor reminded all that September and October are food pantry months.
- The annual Fall Gathering will be held on three days in different areas, Oct 6, Nov. 3, and Nov. 17. A flyer is available for further details. Pastor also noted volunteers are needed to provide transportation for members who are unable to drive to Sunday worship.
- K. Patterson moved to accept the report and C. Hudik made a second. Council approved.
- Committee reports were also received. Highlights included:
 Confirmation class begins Sept. 15 and Property Committee will
 meet Sept. 16. Men's Group buffed the floor in fellowship hall and
 installed an additional exterior outlet. The group also provided candy
 for the fall festival parade and members are discussing developing a
 possible retreat with LOMC. The group also volunteered for yard
 work at a member's home. Stewardship Sunday is planned in
 October.
- In new business, Council approved the continuation of Pastor's health plan with Portico Health Benefits. The ELCA recommended Gold+ plan was approved following a motion by K. Patterson and second by V. Gordon. This year's premiums show an annual increase of \$271.20. Pastor has the right to upgrade to a higher-level plan at her own expense if desired.

- Council also discussed alternative methods of distributing the monthly newsletter as a cost-saving measure. Members brought forward the possibility of emailing the letter to those wanting that delivery method and making printed copies available to other members. Discussion was tabled until further details can be gathered.
- Council also discussed a potential purchase or lease of a color printer for the office. Final quotes are being obtained for further discussion.
- In another matter, the Council agreed to lock the doors of the church building by 6 pm during future fall festivals. Motion was made by C. Hudik with second by V. Gordon. Council will look further into participating in Lena Park District's Trunk or Treat event Oct 19. This will be at no cost to the church.

The History of Our Quilting Ministry at Good Shepherd and The Piece Corps Group

Why do we make quilts? We know they are needed, both here and around the world. But how did all this get started? Who asked us to do this? Or did someone just wake-up one morning and decide to start a quilt ministry in Lena? I didn't know-so I called Joyce Tessendorf. She said that Women's Group Chairman-Pat Dameier had called her and said she had a "sewing project" and some of the churches were already involved and would our church get involved also? Joyce asked what kind of a sewing project? Well Lutheran World Relief (LWR) needed quilts and the request had come from the synod, and so they asked the women's groups to help. Joyce asked what all this would involve and what would we use to make these quilts, we needed some guidelines. Heavy, old wool coats would be used, rip them apart, cut them into squares and sew them into tops, layer the quilt with a back and some inner lining, and pin them on a quilt frame to tie. Then finish binding the quilt. In the Fall the quilts were packed up and taken to Monroe, Wisconsin for shipment to LWR. The call went out and not only our church members, but the Lena Baptist, Catholic, Methodist, and St. John's Lutheran members also got involved. What should we call ourselves? We need a name! Jeannie Engel, Bill Engel's sister, came up with the name-The Piece Corps. Jeannie Engel drew and cut out the letters that are still on the bulletin board downstairs. Even though there were as many as 25 to 30 people-mainly women-in those first years, the quilt count was not high, by today's counts. Today we use cotton and other lightweight fabrics, we still rip things apart and cut squares, but the quilt frames have been replaced by long tables.

That call to make quilts came in 1974-45 years ago, and since that time we have made over 16,716 quilts. (See orange sheet in Fellowship Hall bulletin board to see the latest tally and each year's total.) None of this would be possible without the help of many, many hands, lot's of donations, and God's Love and Prayers. Thank you!
