God has protected our ancestors for 163 years, and God continues to take care of us today. God never stops loving God's children.

We have been in this COVID-19 pandemic for almost 3 months. How are you doing? Frankly speaking, I was exhausted for the first two months. Adjusting to a new lifestyle was stressful, and I missed not seeing my church family. Worries of uncertainty consumed me week after week. I felt overwhelmed. Entering the third month I began to encounter God in odd places. God's angels appeared when I was not sure how to start the worship videos. God's messengers spoke to me when I was weary and afraid. Mysteriously God has kept showing up.

"When you feel stuck and nothing is working out, remember that God's angels show up." Marion told me before. She is right. God's angels show up, and God shows deep care for us. As God took care of the Israelites in their journey to the promised land, God takes care of us.

We may be still in the wilderness, and God is caring for us because God loves us. The love of God be with you, Pr. Miho

News from Pine Ridge Reconciliation Center

Pastor Kay sent a letter to Good Shepherd thanking us for our partnership in ministry. Here is excerpt from her letter. (If you would like to read her letter, it is posted in the bulletin board at church).

The Lutheran/Lakota Job Corps has become an integral part of every aspect of their ministry. The children and youth programming is thriving. The Pine Ridge Presbyterian Church is serving as a space for children and youth to gather and a faith community is beginning to take shape. Pastor Kay ends her service at Pine Ridge at the end of July, and Pastor Dan Johnson will join PRRC. We are raising funds to support the Lakota people during the COVID-19 pandemic. The kingdom heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened (Matthew 13:33)

Basic Homemade Bread From "Taste of Home" Magazine

#### *Ingredients*

1 package (1/4 ounce) active dry yeast

2-1/4 cups warm water

3 Tablespoons sugar plus ½ teaspoon sugar

1 Tablespoon salt

2 Tablespoons canola oil

6-1/4 to 6-3/4 cups bread flour

In a large bowl, dissolve yeast and ½ teaspoon sugar in warm water; let stand until bubbles form on surface. Whisk together remaining 3 Tablespoons sugar, salt and 3 cups flour. Stir oil into yeast mixture; pour into flour mixture and beat until smooth. Stir in enough remaining flour, ½ cup at a time, to form a soft dough.

Turn onto floured surface; knead until smooth and elastic, 8-10 minutes. Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease the top. Cover and let rise in a warm place until doubled,  $1-\frac{1}{2}$  to 2 hours.

Punch dough down. Turn onto a lightly floured surface; divide dough in half. Shape each into a loaf. Place in 2 greased 9x5 inch loaf pans. Cover and let rise until doubled, 1 to  $1^{1/2}$  hours. Bake at 375° until golden brown and bread sound hollow when tapped or has reached in internal temperature of  $200^{\circ}$ , 30-35 minutes. Remove from pans to wire rack to cool.

#### Luther's Morning Blessing

In the morning, as soon as you get out of bed, you are to make the sign of the holy cross and say: "God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit watch over me. Amen."

Then, kneeling or standing, say the Apostles' Creed and the Lord's Prayer. If you wish, you may in addition recite this little prayer as well:

"I give thanks to you, heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ your dear Son, that you have protected me through the night from all harm and danger. I ask that you would also protect me today from sin and all evil, so that my life and actions may please you. Into your hands I commend myself: my body, my soul, and all that is mine. Let your holy angel be with me, so that the wicked foe may have no power over me. Amen."

After singing a hymn perhaps (for example, one on the Ten Commandments) or whatever else may serve your devotion, you are to go to your work joyfully.
