Dear God's beloved,

Numbers are not my strength. I barely passed all my math classes in junior high and high school. I am not good at numbers, especially when the numbers get higher; it takes time for them to sink in. So when I heard that Piece Corps quilting group made 794 quilts since last Fall, it took me a couple days to realize how high that number was. It is definitely the highest number of quilts the Piece Corps has made since it started in 1974. I thought last year's a 659 was big number. Wow! The Piece Corps made more than 100 quilts than last year. I asked the Piece Corps members what made them grow that much, and a quilter responded, "COVID." Because of the COVID-19 pandemic which put us in shelter in place in March and April and May, the Piece Corps members took materials home, cutting squares and sewing tops (and some also sewed masks). Bless their hearts! They worked at home, and one time 100 quilt tops were brought back to church. The Piece Corps quilters continued to do God's work. They never stop doing God's mission of loving.

Their story inspires me. Honestly I am tired of this pandemic life—changing plans, not able to schedule anything, adjusting to new routines, being frustrated at not seeing much progress, and being exposed my own vulnerabilities. It is frustrating and super stressful to live each day. Yet I also hear and witness individuals helping one another, sharing burdens, and caring for each other. God's LOVE mission is continuing even in the midst of the pandemic. God never stops working.

Psalm 121 is called a song of ascent. God's chosen people sang this psalm when they made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. I've never been to Jerusalem, so I do not know how the trip to Jerusalem would look like, but I remember from my past trips near and far that traveling brings excitement, adventures, and scary feelings. Who knows what may happen on the way to yourdestination. We may miss the turn or we may be stuck in the bus terminal for 6 hours. Yet God's people know that God is present on each step of their journey. God does not abandon but stays awake to watch over God's children. We, too, find God who does not slumber nor sleep on our journey.

WORLD FOOD DAY - OCTOBER 16, 2020




Statue of Martin Luther in Eisleben, Germany, his birthplace

Reformation Day,

Anniversary of the day <u>Martin</u> <u>Luther</u> is said to have posted his <u>Ninety-five Theses</u> on the door of the Castle Church in <u>Wittenberg</u>, Germany (October 31, 1517), later identified by Protestants as the beginning of the <u>Reformation</u>.

The European Lutheran territorial churches at first commemorated the Reformation on various days, among them the anniversary of Luther's birth (November 10), his death (February 18), and presentation of the Augsburg Confession (June 25). The centennial celebrations of 1617 focused attention on October 31. In the sesquicentennial year (1667), Elector of Saxony John George II decreed this date as annual Reformation Day in Saxony. German Lutheran and Union territorial churches have gradually come to follow this example and specify October 31 or the Sunday following (or preceding).

Among English-speaking Lutherans, the churches that use the Lutheran Liturgy (1948) keep October 31 as Reformation Day. Those using the Service Book and Hymnal (1958) observe October 31 as Reformation Day and may keep the preceding Sunday as Reformation Sunday. The liturgical color is red. Many churches in the Reformed and the Evangelical traditions also mark the day, often with special services focused on the Reformation and its effects.



Martin Luther's Small Catechism The CREED

The Third Article: On Being Made Holy

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

What does this mean?

I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith, just as he calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy the whole Christian church on earth and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one common, true faith. Daily in this Christian church the Holy Spirit abundantly forgives all sins—mine and those of all believers. On the last day the Holy Spirit will raise me and all the dead and will give to me and all believers in Christ eternal life. This is most certainly true.
