I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. Isaiah 43:19


Dear God's beloved,

When we are on the road, we find work ahead signs and detour signs a lot. I am not keen on these road signs because they always screw up my road plans. (Did I tell you my "totally lost in Rockford" story?) Whether I like it or not, the roads need new pavement and maintenance, and I try to be appreciating of those who work on the road on such hot days. (Thank you so much for your hard work!)

God does new things. God makes a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. Our God creates something new everyday in our lives and in the world God loves dearly. And we have a new bishop. Pastor Stacie Fidlar was elected as our next bishop of the Northern Illinois Synod at the synod assembly. I am very excited about our new bishop not only because she will be the first female bishop in our synod but also Pr.Stacie is a compassionate caring person who talked to me when I was at the synod assembly as a first call candidate 6 years ago. In those days, pastoral candidates were assigned to the synod in their first calls. When the synod assembly was held in June, I was still new to the synod. The synod kindly invited me to attend the synod assembly at Augustana College as a guest. It was a three-day assembly involving the bishop's election. I stayed at the dormitory and was lonely. I did not know many people in this synod. A few people I knew were Bishop Gary (who called me when I was assigned to NIS), Denny (whom just met at the call committee meeting a few weeks before), Pastor Paul (who was my supervisor at the pre-internship field education), and some classmates from seminary. I sat by myself in the huge auditorium during the assembly. One morning Pr. Stacie came to me when I was sitting in the back of the auditorium. She had some clerical collars in her hand. She asked, "Is this your size?" I put one around my neck, and it seemed to work. She smiled and gave me a bag with several collars and said, "Glad you can use them." She explained that these collars used to belong to a female pastor in the synod who died in a car accident. She kept the collars and the legacy of the pastor, and passed them on to a new pastoral candidate in the synod. I hope this story tells you a little bit about our bishopelect Pr. Stacie. Our new bishop will bring gifts and leaderships in our synod with deep compassion.

God does new things. God spoke to God's people in exile that God is going to do a new thing. God will bring hope to people experiencing despair. God does new things. Oh, no I do not have enough space to tell you about the assembly. 





Highlights from the April Council Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Council was called to order by President Wayne Kurth at 6:40 pm on April 21, 2022.

Secretary's Report: The Secretary's Report for the March 17 meeting was reviewed. Having no additions or corrections, the report was approved.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Jay Andrews reported that the budget is still behind for the year and that we are behind about \$4,000 for the month of March. He transferred \$2,000 from the Revolving Cash Fund in order to meet payroll at the end of March and another \$2,000 to meet payroll the middle of April. Electric Bill \$216.34 Gas/Heat Bill \$1,511.74.

The Treasurer's Report was approved as presented.

Pastors Report: Pastor Miho Yasukawa highlighted the Synod Assembly coming up in June. She thanked Kristy Patterson for being the Female Delegate. She also noted that the ELCA National Youth Gathering will be in New Orleans on July 16 to 20, 2024. The Food Pantry in March served

64 families with 164 people served. The next volunteer date is April 23. The Food Pantry will be utilizing another room at the site. This will cause the rent to go up slightly in the future. Pastor's Report was approved as presented.

Committee Reports:

Stewardship Committee: The committee is seeking any ideas as to how to help improve the attendance at church.

Learning and Youth Committee: The youth had a great day doing sidewalk art for Easter. Upcoming events: May 7, LOMC Work Day; May 8, Graduation Recognition Sunday: KOA camp out sometime this summer; and Youth and Anyone activity twice a month during the summer for fun and fellowship. There next meeting will be on July 10, at 11:00 am. **Service Committee**: Continuing to volunteer at the Food Pantry. Volunteers are needed for June.

Finance committee: The committee will be scheduling a meeting in the future.

Property Committee: There will be an upcoming meeting.

Scholarship Committee: The forms are out to apply for the Good Shepherd Scholarship. Men's Ministry: Next meeting will be April 30 at 4:30 pm.

All Committee Reports were approved as presented.

Old Business:

Constitution Committee: There will be a meeting on April 28 at 7:00 pm.

Shared Ministry: Still working on. Waiting for a call beck from either Pastor Bitner or Pastor Schlesinger.

Membership: Working on.

New Business:

Gutter Guards: Checking on if the quote has gone up.

Food Pantry Distribution: Good Shepherd's supporting of the Food Pantry rent is due in April and November. A question was asked if other churches helped with the rent at the Food Pantry. Treasurer Jay Andrews stated that yes other churches, as well as some organizations support the Food Pantry with money donations. The rent payment is normally taken from the Lucille Baker Endowment Fund. Virgil Gordon made a motion to take \$600 from the Lucille Baker Endowment Fund account to pay for the Food Pantry rent. Kristy Patterson seconded the motion. The motion was approved.

Pastor's Vacation: Pastor Miho is requesting vacation time from May 27, 2022 through May 31. 2022. This will include Sunday May 29, 2022. Pastor will find someone to cover any Pastoral Care that may be needed. It was suggested that instead of getting a supply Pastor, that it would be nice to have a Hymn Sing Sunday. It would be nice to include Favorite Hymns from the Congregation. This should be announced at Sunday morning worship and put in the May Newsletter with the last day to submit a Favorite Hymn being Sunday May 22, 2022. Pastor's vacation was approved.

> The Rev. Stacie Fidlar Elected Bishop 2022 Synod Assembly



June 18, 2022

The Rev. Stacie Fidlar of Rock Island, IL was elected June 18th to serve a six-year term as bishop of Northern Illinois Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during the synod assembly which met online on June 5th and 12th and then in person at Augustana College in Rock Island on June 17-18.

Fidlar was elected on the 5th ballot with 219 votes to 111 votes for the Rev. Dr. Janet Hunt, pastor of First Lutheran Church in DeKalb, IL. A total of 166 votes was needed for election.

The bishop-elect has served as pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church in Rock Island, IL since 1999. She served as pastor of Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Seneca, IL from 1995-1999 and as interim pastor of St. James Lutheran Church in Forreston, IL in 1995.

Fidlar earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Religion with Asian Studies concentrations from Augustana College in Rock Island, IL in 1991 and her Master of Divinity degree from Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago in 1995. She completed the Shalem Institute group Leaders Program in 2002 and participates in ongoing continuing education with foci on leadership, spirituality, and foundations management.

Fidlar will take office on September 1, and her installation is scheduled for October 8 at Trinity Lutheran Church in Rockford, IL. Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton will officiate the installation.

Retiring Bishop Jeffrey Clements has served as bishop of the Northern Illinois Synod since 2016.




