Highlights from October Council Meetings

The regular Church Council meeting of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church was held on October 19, 2023. president Jonathon Kurth called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.

Secretary's Report: The Secretary's Minutes were presented to the Council. Having no additions or corrections, the Secretary's Minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Jay Andrews presented the Treasurer's Report. In the last month there was about \$4,600. of income for the church with the expenses staying fairly consistent. This is currently not enough to meet current budgeted expenses. The deficit is currently \$13,000.

Gas Bill: \$166.54 Electric Bill: \$159.78

Treasurer's Report was approved.

Vicar's Report: Vicar Tomas Mosbo highlighted his report. He and Coral had a wonderful trip to Coral's 50th high school reunion in New York. Vicar also noted that he was approved by Warburg Seminary Faculty as completing his requirements to become a pastor. Vicar has also had an interview with Bishop Fidlar to confirm his placement in the Northern Illinois Synod. His final interview with Synod Candidacy Committee will be on October 19, 2023 after which the Bishop will be informed by the committee of his approval. Otherwise Vicar Thomas has carried out his other duties of attending committee meetings bulletin and worship preparations, visiting the sick and shut-in and preparing for the Fall Festival. The Vicar's report was approved.

Committee Reports:

Stewardship Committee: Coralyn Hudik passed around a pledge card for the Council to look over. The pledge cards are to be sent out to the members with options on their giving and the ways to help make their giving easier. Coralyn also stated that it would be nice to purchase a stole for Vicar Thomas Mosbo upon his Ordination from church.

Finance Committee: Jay Andrews reported to the committee that the income for the month of September was \$4,568.00 and the expenses were \$6,798.00 with a monthly deficit of \$2,230.00. Several options were discussed including the elimination of funds from the budget for the Web Site, Christian Education, Supply Pastor and Janitor. Also it was suggested to review the Church Insurance and get quotes from other Insurance Agencies to compare with our current insurance in an effort to reduce costs. Wayne Kurth also suggested it may be better to concentrate on trying to increase attendance rather than cutting expenses. A question was asked as to when we renew our contract with the Web Site. Jay Andrews answered that happened in the spring.

Men's Group: The Men's Group will be having their annual Steak Fry on October 28, 2023 and will be meeting at 4:00pm. The cost will be \$20.00 for the meal.

Having no other Committee Reports to review, a motion was made to approve all reports as presented. All Committee Reports were approved as presented.

Old Business:

Constitution: The Committee is working with the Synod. The wrong copy was sent in but they now think that they have the right copy and will be sending it off soon.



FESTIVALS AND COMMEMORATIONS

Katharina von Bora Luther, renewer of the church, died on December 20, 1552.

Born to an impoverished nobleman, when Katharina (Katie) was five her mother died and she was sent to live in a convent. She later took vows as a nun, but around age twenty-four she and several other nuns who were influenced by the writings of Martin Luther left the convent. Six children were born to Katie and Martin. Though initially Luther felt little affection for Katie, she proved herself a gifted household manager and became a trusted partner. She was so influential that Luther took to calling her "my lord Katie."
