April 25 Mark, Evangelist Born c. 12AD -Died c. 68AD (aged c. 56)

Though Mark himself was not an apostle, it is likely that he was a member of one of the early Christian communities. It is possible that he is the John Mark of Acts 12 whose mother owned the house where the apostles gathered. The gospel attributed to him is brief and direct. It is considered by many to be the earliest gospel.

Mark the Evangelist, also known as John Mark or Saint Mark, is the person who is traditionally ascribed to be the author of the Gospel of Mark. Modern Bible scholars have concluded that the Gospel of Mark was written by an anonymous author rather than an identifiable historical figure. According to Church tradition, Mark founded the Episcopal see of Alexandria, which was one of the five most important sees of early Christianity. Tradition has it that Mark went to preach in Alexandria, Egypt, became the first bishop there, and was martyred. His feast day is celebrated on April 25, and his symbol is the winged lion.

Highlights from March 14, 2023 Church Council Meeting

Good Shepherd Council met March 14. Devotions and refreshments were provided Following additions and corrections, the agenda was approved

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Jay Andrews presented the Treasurer's Report. The full report approved.

Gas Bill \$959.23

Electric Bill \$230.33

Pastor Mosbo's Report: The church website is now live. The full report was approved.

Committee Reports

Stewardship Committee: Discussion was held regarding the repainting and repair of the church sign which stands on Stagecoach Trail across from Coach's Golf and Grill. Trees surrounding the sign also need trimming. The committee also had post cards designed announcing the Holy Week schedule and they will be mailed. Discussion was given to a potential Health Check Day to be held in the church.

Property Committee: submitted two recommendations for approval.

First was the topic of releasing the current janitor, Christa Wichman, from her position due to lack of service. Coralyn Hudik motioned to have Tim Gordon, president of the Property Committee, and Patterson, Council President, have a conversation with Wichman regarding discontinuing the position along with expected quality of work before making the release final.

Council also approved the Committee's suggestion to accept the lower of two bids to update the electrical system. The current insurance carrier requested an inspection of the system which determined the fuse box needs to be updated to a circuit breaker system. The proposed bid from Electric Guys of \$1995.45 for a 200 amp box was approved. Funds are to be taken from the Special Funds BMI Interest Fund. The higher bid had been submitted from Pro Source Electric for \$2,350 for a 100 amp box.

The full slate of committee reports was approved.

Old Business

In Old Business: The Jim Swain Bequest, which was below \$10,000, was discussed. A motioned to designate the money to the Special Funds Trust – Enduring Gifts Interest passed unanimously.

The meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.

Stephen was mentioned for the first time in Act 6:5 of the Bible.

He was a deacon and is introduced in the Bible as a faithful man of God. Stephen is known for being the first Christian martyr.

One of the seven men chosen by the early Church, Stephen was responsible for distributing food to the Grecian widows, who had been overlooked by the church. He had the power of healing people, which is a gift bestowed upon him by the Holy Spirit. Only a few people were known to possess charismatic powers like the Lord Jesus Christ and Saint Stephen was one of them.

Stephen was a Greek-speaking Jew, called a Hellenist, and had ample knowledge about the Scriptures. According to Act seven where he is seen to apologize to the Jewish Council, the Sanhedrin, his Hellenistic dialect also had a Hebrew note to it, which gives us the idea that he was raised out of Jerusalem and was a foreign-born Jew just like many others.

The Jews of the Roman empire always questioned God's grace in terms of Christianity and whenever they failed to produce an argument, oppositions and false claims were put forth by them. Stephen stood by the words of Jesus Christ, and so he was opposed by the Synagogue of the Freedmen, which involved the Alexandrians and the Cyrenians. As they couldn't fabricate any counterargument to Stephen's vision, they produced false witnesses against him.

Stephen provided a point-by-point explanation following the Old Testament and put forth the various examples angering those who condemned Jesus. Stephen's death sentence was rolled out by the Sanhedrin members, who couldn't tolerate the words of this gifted preacher.
