

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE with Mr. Furr

L: The 1st READING is from Isaiah 53:4-12







FIRST, WE GIVE OF OURSELVES:

"Gratitude and When Enough is Enough"

Over the course of this week, our Bible text from Luke 12:13-21 initiates a conversation that urges us consider the issues of possessions, their influence upon our relationship with God, gratitude, and how we live as disciples. In other words asking, "when is it that enough is enough?"

The posture of gratitude helps us to consider and live into the question of how we deal with possessions. Gratitude fosters an understanding that what we have is given by God, that there is enough, and we are called to use what we have been given for ministry in family, church, community, and the world.
