



THE LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

One of the best known customs for the season is the Advent wreath. The wreath and winter candle-lighting in the midst of growing darkness strengthen some of the Advent images found in the Bible. The unbroken circle of greens is an image of everlasting life, a victory wreath, the crown of Christ, or the wheel of time itself. Christians use the wreath as a sign that Christ reaches into our time to lead us to the light of everlasting life. The four candles mark the progress of the four weeks of Advent and the growth of light.

L: At every beginning there is a yearning for the one who is coming. O Emmanuel,

C: Wake us up to your coming.

L: We gather together to expect the unexpected and imagine the unimaginable. O Emmanuel,

L: We stay awake by telling stories that offer a glimmer of a future and agitate dormant hope within us. O Emmanuel,


C: Wake us up to your coming.






