### I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope (Psalm 130:5)

Do you do anything special for Lent? Are you fasting or giving up something for forty days? In our church worship, we will fast from singing and saying "Alleluia" during Lent. We spend more time with silence, reflection, and pondering the mystery of God's salvation. Lent was not my favorite season of the church year because the Lenten season eventually leads to the death of Jesus. If I chose a color for Lent, I would choose gray. It used to be a sad depressing season for me. Last year, my forty days were miserable. I caught a cold which lingered throughout Lent, and I missed Sunday services and Holy Week services. In addition, I was mourning of the loss of my mother. She died in May and following cultural custom, all our family members formally mourned for a year. We had no celebrations, no New Year's greetings, nothing festive. Last March was especially hard because it brought back all the memories about what our family did together with my mother. I was depressed. I did not see any hope in those days. Lent was hard. I began folding origami papers to make Easter cards as my Lenten discipline. I cut the papers into squares and folded them one by one. Every paper I folded with a prayer. I asked God to give me peace, and I prayed for those who were grieving. I have been folding papers and making cards for years, but last year's Easter cards became special. They were the signs of God's blessing, the sign of new life in Christ Jesus. Last year's Lenten journey felt long but it deepened my relationship with God.

Lent is a good opportunity to spend time with God through prayers, devotions, worship, and serving others. What would you like to do this year? At church, there are mid-week worship opportunities, the offering of thanks to God through the Thankful Quilt, and special devotion books.

#### **Highlights from February Council Meetings**

- Jay Andrews presented the Treasurer's Report. January's electric bill was \$216.13 and the gas bill was \$896.03. With a voice vote, the Council unanimously accepted the report.
- Good Shepherd will host the Lenten Luncheon March 8 and WELCA will serve. Midweek evening services will be held March 8, 15, 22 and 29<sup>th</sup>
- Denny Luke said Dodd's Park has been reserved Aug. 6 for the annual outdoor service..
- Coralyn Hudik said several updates were made on the mailing list for the Stewardship Committee. Also, the list was increased to include people who were baptized or had family members baptized at Good Shepherd but had not been previously included.
- On behalf of the property committee, Denny Luke, Tim Gordon and Troy Doubler spoke on the condition of the sound system.
- Troy Doubler also spoke for the Men's Ministry. He said paint has been purchased for the upstairs classrooms and suggestions were heard for getting the painting completed. Doubler also said the radio tubes have been sent out and finishing the garden shed project will be scheduled as weather allows.
- The Men's Ministry will assist the upcoming Lock-In by preparing pizza for the group.
- Pastor Miho described the Reformation 500 Bookstore Program. A display and order sheets for books available for purchase will be set up during Lent. Books will be relevant to a variety of ages and interests. There is no minimum order required to participate.
- Tim Gordon reviewed progress for the 160<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration and pointed out updates that will be made to the banner. Denny Luke said that Bishop Clements will be at Good Shepherd July 16<sup>th</sup> in honor of the anniversary.
- A remedy for ongoing problems with the telephone system may be available through a new carrier. Mediacom has now been contracted to supply the service at a monthly savings to Good Shepherd.
- On behalf of the Property Committee, Denny Luke presented a list of building concerns.
- A complete copy of February Councils Minutes is posted on the Bulletin Board.

## **Sunday School History**

Sunday School has changed over the years. The classroom was a glassed in room on the north wall of fellowship room. All classes met there 1-6 grades. There were usually 6 teachers to take the job of leading the Sunday School. We had little wooden chairs (you may

have one) around the tables. The great deal was get the lesson done so you could play at the sand table at the end of the room.

Our lessons were on 8x8 papers that folded in a book shape. It always had a picture on it and a different story each Sunday. During class time the Pastor would come and give a short message. We had some great teachers. I had Ruby Tullshe was a great teacher and a favorite. There was a piano in the room where we learned to sing "Jesus Loves Me."

Everyone was afraid to use the bathroom, located by the kitchen. When you sat down the toilet began to flush and you thought you were going down the drain.

The 7 & 8 grade met in a corner of fellowship hall. The high school met in the Kat a Kom a place under the steps. The other group met in what now is the sound room. The adult men met in the center of fellowship hall. The ladies met in Janice's music room. One of the great Sunday School leaders was Jasper Berhenke.

We always had Christmas programs and children programs each year. Everyone took part and even the adults had a play they performed.

At one time we had five choirs. Each Sunday a different choir would perform. It always was good and everyone was proud of them. We had Luther League for the high school youth. They would meet one Sunday night a month a topic would be discuss and fellowship would follow.

Then came the problem: it was like the woman that had so many children she didn't know what to do - that was the problem we had. So the congregation decided to add an education building on to the church. Work was quickly done and completed in 1964. We now had a place for everyone in Sunday School. All the rooms were filled and new curriculum was introduced. With Immanuel merging with Amity we had spare room for everyone.

In the summer we have a great Vacation Bible School. There were many dedicated teachers and helpers to make a great week, Bible work, crafts, playtime and refreshments.

We still have Sunday School, Confirmation and First Communion class. Our numbers right now are low but with prayer and hope we will again have a large group. Our teachers are very dedicated and are waiting with open arms.

vide desserts for the fellowship, attended the presentation and donated to the next mission trip to Pine Ridge.


