Highlights from February Council Meetings

- The Treasurers Report was presented by Treasurer Jay Andrews. January electric bill was \$230.18 and the gas bill was \$941.79.
- The Pastor's Report was presented. Upcoming events include: The Lenten noon lunch at Good Shepherd Feb. 21; WELCA Spring Retreat April 28; and NIS Assembly June 15-16 at Augustana College. Pastor Miho has been nominated as a delegate for a voting member from the NIS at the 2019 Church wide Assembly to be held in Milwaukee.
- On behalf of the Learning Committee Kristy Patterson reported on fundraising events for the National Youth Gathering to be held in June in Texas. A Fun Fair is set for March 6 at the Pearl City High School. It will be open to the public. Patterson also reported on tentative plans for this summer's Vacation Bible School and a video presentation by the church's youth during the children's sermon.
- Denny Luke and Troy Doubler, Property Committee, said meetings are planned to discuss improvements for the sanctuary sound system to determine cost and design.
- Scholarship Committee Chair Marybeth Brinker provided a written report. The committee reviewed and accepted grades submitted by Sondra Winters and Colton Brinker. A check for \$750 will be sent to each of these scholarship applicants, pending Council approval. The committee reviewed the financial status of the scholarship fund and recommended the scholarship amount be increased to \$1000 per applicant with a maximum amount awarded not to exceed \$2000 a year. The Council unanimously approved the recommendation as written.
- In other committee action, Troy Doubler resigned as chairman of the Face Book Committee; Denny Luke said the WELCA will provide lunch for the Feb. 21 Noon Lenten Service; Troy Doubler and Jay Andrews, Men's Group, said more than \$2000 has been raised from selling electrical tubes.
- Troy Doubler said the boiler will need repairs. Repair services indicated a larger regulator may be required and Nicor was consulted for larger gas delivery. The project will be undertaken in warm weather.
- A complete copy of minutes will be posted on the bulletin board.




