

Highlights from October Council Meetings

- Council welcomed guest Parson Bob Stark from First Lutheran Church, Mt. Carroll. Parson led devotions speaking on 5 Steps of Faith and also shared information on Synod's practice which is to return 100% of mission donations to projects worldwide Council members highlighted Good Shepherd's strengths, some of which included presence in the community, shared Vacation Bible School, Pastor Miho's dedication to the congregation, the Men's Group which practices helping others, support of the local food pantry and the Piece Corps quilt donations. The church's challenges of small Sunday School attendance, an aging congregation and diminished attendance were mentioned.
- Jay Andrews presented the Treasurer's Report pointing out the September electric bill of \$168.19 and a gas bill of \$129.95. Kristy Patterson moved to accept the report and Krista Keene seconded with all Council in agreement.
- Pastor Miho reviewed her monthly report which included highlights: suggesting moving the church's booth at the Lions Fall Festival back to its prior location at the corner which offers a quieter opportunity to visit with festival goers along with more space; announcement that 610 quilts are to be shipped out to various locations and missions; Learned Lena-Winslow Elementary will be happy to receive sock donations collected over the Christmas season; and plans are made to attend the Family Outing to LOMC Oct. 14. Council accepted the report following a motion by Kristy Patterson and second by Krista Keene.
- Recommendation from Chris Brinker, Property Committee Chairman, to replace the sound system in the sanctuary for an estimated \$14,000 was presented. Following discussion on bylaws and protocol, Virgil Gordon motioned to bring the suggestion to update the sound system for an estimated \$14,000 not to exceed \$14,500 forward at the annual meeting for a congregational vote. The motion was seconded by Bari Raymer and Council gave full approval.
- In other business, Council discussed and tabled mission contributions until the November meeting. The nomination of Ethan Fye for confirmation was fully approved with Kristy Patterson making the motion and Virgil Gordon offering a second.

Kristy Patterson moved to adjourn the meeting and Virgil Gordon made the second. Council closed with the Lord's Prayer.


