

It made all of us laugh. Christmas caroling is not just singing old favorite Christmas hymns but also bringing joys and smiles. Each place which we stopped by, I felt the presence of God. I sensed God was singing and laughing with us. It made my heart warm and filled me with joy. Together we were tasting love.

When are the times you feel or sense God is present?

Do you have times when God shows up unexpectedly which makes you feel awe and wonder? I bet that the shepherds did, too. They were surprised when God's messenger showed up while they were working that night. And they told their sacred stories to Mary, Joseph, Jesus and all the guests at the stable. The shepherds shared their God moments so that more people would know about this special baby, Jesus, who is the savior. We are shepherds too because God comes to us and tells us that God cares for us. What are your stories? Tell me about your sacred stories because your stories help me to grow in my relationship with God. I love to hear your God moments. By sharing our sacred stories, we grow in faith together. May God guide us on our journey together.

#### **Highlights from December Council Meetings**

- The Treasurer's Report was reviewed reflecting a November Gas bill of \$343.35 and electric bill of \$146.72. Kristy Patterson moved to approve the report and Gene Hesselbacher made the second. Council approved unanimously.
- The Pastor's Report included special mention of children's participation in recent events. Youth took part in the float for the Lena Christmas parade and they helped decorate the church and sanctuary. An OWL Night (overnight lock in) is planned for Dec. 21 22 and Pastor said adult assistance is needed especially for breakfast time.
- The church was one of four hosts for the Lena Christmas Tour of Homes and a generous donation of food and money was contributed by church members and guests.
- A sock drive is planned over the Christmas season ending Jan. 6. These gifts will be presented to the Lena-Winslow Elementary.
- Pastor also discussed the WELCA mission trip to Rocky Boy Indian Reservation, Montana, Aug. 24 – 31, 2019. Pastor plans to attend and has details for others who are interested. Kristy Patterson moved to accept Pastor's report and Virgil Gordon seconded. All approved.
- Kristy Patterson also spoke on youth activities which included the children's Christmas Program and participation in the Christmas Eve service. She also said the children were a big help in making many dozens of cookies for sharing.
- Dennis Luke said the ceiling on the main entry has been repaired and this work will help stop future flaking. Troy Doubler said all the exterior railings are now in place.
- It was also pointed out that nominations for the 2019 Council are being sought. Four positions will be open.
- All committee reports were approved with a motion by Gene Hesselbacher and second by Kristy Patterson.
- Funding for the proposed sound system was discussed and tabled until the January meeting. The proposal will be brought to the congregation for approval at the annual meeting Jan. 27, 2019. Individual donations from church members will also be accepted for the project.

#### **Highlights from December Council Meetings**

- Council approved an action to allow Good Shepherd to be used as an emergency shelter for Lena-Winslow Schools and the Lena Living Center. Upon a motion from Virgil Gordon and second by Kristy Patterson, Council fully approved. Should these services be needed, it is understood the church may not provide medical care or services for those in need.
- In new business, Dennis Luke presented the proposed 2019 budget. The document reflects budget reductions of approximately \$6,000 overall. This reduction includes decreasing amounts in accounts that had excess funds and cuts in other areas. Gene Hesselbacher moved to accept the budget and Bari Raymer made the second. Council unanimously approved. The budget will be brought to the congregation for approval at the annual meeting.
- Council also approved vacation days of Jan. 1-5, 2019, for Pastor Miho. Kristy Patterson made the motion and Krista Keene seconded. All approved.

The next meeting is planned for Jan. 8.






#### **Worship News**

Christmas ends after twelve days. And the thirteenth day is called Epiphany.

Epiphany means "manifestation." On this day we celebrate the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles—that is, to all nations. Some Christian traditions celebrate three great epiphanies on this day: the magi's adoration of the Christ child, Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River, and his first miracle, in which he changes water into wine. The word and sacraments are for us the great epiphany of God's grace and mercy. We go forth to witness to the light that shines brightly in our midst. (from *Sundays and Seasons*) Our January worship brings us the revelation of Christ as Savior of the world (January 6), as God's beloved (January 13), through the first miracle (January 20), and through reading of scripture, from prophet Isaiah (January 27)



You can do this and more when participating in a cross-cultural exchange experience coordinated by Women of the FLCA.

The next cross-cultural servant/immersion experience will take place August 24th-31st, 2019, on the Rocky Boy Reservation of the Chippewa Cree Tribe in Box Elder, Montana. The host congregation, Our Savior's Lutheran Church, has been working with the people of the Chippewa Cree Tribe since the early 1920's. Registration is \$375 and includes most meals. sleeping accommodations and activity fees. Men are also welcome to join the trip.




