Dear God's beloved,


Have you encountered the Holy Spirit lately? I bet this is a strange question, but one that I have in mind these days. God's Spirit is everywhere, making surprise appearances in my life. The most recent time God's Spirit visited me was when I was at a wedding reception. It was a very lovely reception: good food, good music, good company, and just being happy to share joy with the newlyweds and their families. I surely enjoyed it. And there was a deck of cards on each table, and for no specific reason, (or maybe I just felt brave) I asked my husband to teach me how to play euchre, a card game. Euchre is his family's tradition. Every time the family gets together, they play euchre after the feast. A long time ago, my husband showed me how to play, but I had no interest nor patience to learn a new game. It was too complicated to master. So once again, my husband showed me how to play euchre at the wedding reception. We asked Donna and Dale to play with us so that I could see how the game works with actual hands. (Thanks to Donna and Dale!) First we started with open hands while my husband gave instruction on which card to play. After several rounds, the real test came—I had to play by myself. I was not sure which card to play and was constantly asking questions, like "What is the suit?" "Which card is the highest?' "Do I need to play a spade if I have one in my hand?" All the sudden, the Holy Spirit came. This time it had the face of Kristy. The Spirit helped me each time when my turn came, giving me advice which card to play. (and I won some times!) And the Spirit appeared to Donna and Dale too. God's Spirit showed up.

When Jesus was leaving from the earth, he promised to his disciples the gift of God's Spirit. This advocate (or sometime it is translated as helper) would guide them, help them with what to say in court, and remind them of the loving God. I think that the Holy Spirit is like teachers who point us to God who cares and who is present with us in our joy and sorrow. When we have questions and feeling overwhelmed by uncertainties. God's Spirit reminds us of the presence of God whose love is unconditional. And truly it is a gift from God. Did you know that it is the Holy Spirit who makes us holy and keeps us in faith? Revised Covid Guidelines for Good Shepherd

With Covid restrictions being lifted, the Church Council has reviewed the Covid Guidelines for Good Shepherd and have made the following recommendations:

- Masks: Recommendation; that all non-vaccinated people should wear a mask inside the church.
- **Fellowship Hour:** We can now safely resume Fellowship Hour with moderate social distancing.
- Entry: All doors are open. No temperatures will be checked but hand sanitizer will be available for anyone wishing to use it.
- Offering: At this time, the offering plates will be left where they are.
- **Communion:** We continue with the same self-serve communion cups at this time, and will resume regular communion in August or September.
- Sharing the Peace: Will continue as we are now doing.
- **Restrooms and Elevator:** These are open to multiple person use.
- **Choir:** Choir and Bell Choir will start in person rehearsal August 29th, with first choir performance at Worship Service on September 26th, 2021.

After reviewing the Guidelines, the Council has recommended that they would be publicized in the July Church Newsletter. Guidelines have been reviewed and approved by the Church Council.

Worship Volunteers needed

We are updating our list of those who can help with Sunday worship.

Council has decided that instead of having separate ushers for communion, that the Worship Ushers could assist with communion as well as be greeters. Sound and Power Point will continue with two people, and the Lector and Worship Assistant could be the same person. Live Stream operation will be one person, and the Elevator Operator can be done by one person. This will require 7 volunteers weekly. We will help you learn how to do each task.

If you are available to help, contact the church office with the your name, phone number and the area you are willing to volunteer. There is also a sign up sheet on the bulletin board by the Fellowship Hall .

Highlights from June 17th Church Council Meeting

Secretary's Report: The minutes of the May 13, 2021 Church Council Meeting were reviewed and

approved.

Treasurer's Report: Jay Andrews reported that the Payroll Protection Program money had been

received. The total amount received was \$10,792.89

Heating: 619.16 Electric: 163.96

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported that she had done two funerals since the last meeting and that a New Bible Study group was starting June 22. She also that the application for the Open Door Grant was completed and submitted. She is waiting for the results of the application.

Committee Reports:

- Stewardship Committee: Coralyn Hudik reported that the committee is looking to having activities at the Fall Festival. She also reported that the former group Young at Hearts is being renamed to Never to Young and that an event is being planned at Coralyn's farm west of Lena for July 25, 2021.
- Learning and Youth Committee: Kristy Patterson gave a recap of last months report.
- **Property Committee:** The Village of Lena has sent a letter about a possible water leak in the church. The committee will check this out. Tim Gordon also reported that the new laptop computer is here and working.
- Men's Group: Wayne Kurth reported that the Men's Group is getting together again and looking to sing at a Worship Service and plan other activities in the future.

New Business:

With Covid restrictions changing, Council reviewed our Covid Guidelines and recommended the following changes:

- Masks: To recommend that all non vaccinated people should wear a mask inside the Church.
- **Fellowship Hour:** We can now safely resume Fellowship Hour with moderate social distancing.
- Entry: All doors are open. No temperatures will be checked but hand sanitizer will be available if anyone wishes to use it.
- Offering: At this time, the Offering Plates will be left where they are.
- Communion: To continue with the self serve communion cups at this time. Resume regular communion in August or September.
- Shearing the Peace: Will continue as we are now doing.
- Restrooms and Elevator: These are open for multiple persons to use at the same time.

Choir: Choir and Bell Choir will start in person rehearsal in September with the first Choir performance in Worship Service on September 26, 2021

Worship Volunteers: It was decided that the Ushers could be Communion Ushers as well as the Greeters. Sound System and Power Point should be two people. One person for Worship Assistant and Lector as well as one person for Live Stream and one for the Elevator.





A Brief History of Bananas

The Sacrament of Holy Baptism


What is baptism?
