

Dear God's beloved,

This Fall has been amazing. Piece Corps Quilting ministry made 700 quilts since last Fall (thanks to their faithful work!) and took 7 vehicles full of boxes of quilts and 40 personal care kits to LWR collection in Monroe. Also this year's Fall Festival was a great success! I'd like to thank the Lena Lions Club for their hard work and the Good Shepherd family for your help with the Fall Festival float and hospitality tent. The weather was gorgeous (Thanks to Bob and Lynn for their special dance.), and the parade was lots of fun (The Good Shepherd float was awesome!). It was a joy-filled two days.

At the hospitality tent, we had Bible Trivia. Did you try it? It had multiple choice questions, and people drew a question from a jar. If they got the correct answer, they got a prize. It was an excellent opportunity to create conversation with friends and strangers. (Thanks to Cora for the great idea!) I tried it and picked the wrong answer. (Did you know that Abraham and Isaac went to the land of Moriah?) I learned something new.

The Bible is a collection of stories of God and God's children. These old stories tell us about God who is faithful to God's children in spite of their flaws. God journeys with them to Egypt, in the wilderness, to Jerusalem, and in Galilee. Stories in the Bible are fascinating. I love to read the stories in the Bible. It is mysterious that scripture speaks something new each time I read it, especially when I read with you guys. God speaks through the Bible.

In October we are celebrating the Reformation which Martin Luther started in 1517. The Reformation was a movement which expanded relationships between God and God's people. Luther believed that God could speak to individual parishioners directly. One of his contributions was translating the Bible into the language of the people. With the help of the printing press, German speaking people were able to read the Bible and to hear stories of God and God's people in their homes. The families could treasure stories like Jesus walking on the water to meet his disciples and the story of David and Goliath. Scripture is the living word of God. As the psalmist expressed, God's words (and stories) are a lamp to our feet as we walk through adventures in life. In times like this (living in the global pandemic, social unrest, and facing constant disasters) I find that the stories of God and God's people help me to see the holy light. God's stories give us life. May God's grace surround you.

Each and every Wednesday morning-for 47 years, the members of Piece Corps meet at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Fellowship Hall from 8:00am to 11:30am to assemble quilts. There are so many people who help make this ministry possible: the sewers, fabric cutters, ironers, quilt tiers, quilt binders, those who supply us with donations of fabric, batting, thread, and money, and finally—those who pack-up and transport the quilts to Monroe, Wisconsin and load them on the semi so they get to the people who need them.

Each year, on Quilt Sunday, the church is draped with quilts. We thank God that He has given us Work to do that impacts so many others. We will never know all the people who benefit from our quilts; but we know God's Love and Work is never done; and so each year we strive to do our best.

Our Quilt Ministry and Piece Corps had another very successful year. 700 quilts were made this year. Since 1974 (47 years) a total of 18,210 quilts have been made and sent. We do keep score! Thank you to everyone for your help and support. None of this would be possible without the help of many, many hands, lots of donations, and God's Love and Prayers.

Highlights from August 19th Church Council Meeting

Secretary's Report: The July 2021 minutes were reviewed. Noting a couple of spelling errors,

the Secretary's Report was approved as corrected.

Treasurer's Report: Jay Andrews reported that the paper work for the Forgiveness of the Pay-

roll Protection Program has been completed and turned into the bank. He is now waiting for notification of the loan being forgiven. Jay had to also transfer \$2,000 from the Revolving Cash Fund into the general fund leaving a balance of \$5,000 in the Revolving Cash Fund. Electric bill was

\$177.96, Gas bill was \$306.36. Treasurer's Report was accepted.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Miho reported that Rev. Pat Esker will be filling the pulpit on August

29, 2021 while she takes a vacation day. Rev. Esker has requested that instead of being paid for coming to preach, that the offering from the August 29th Worship Service be given to the Synod Mission Support. Pas-

tor's Report was approved.

• Worship and Music Committee: The Committee will be meeting on August 25, 2021 at 6:30 pm.

- Stewardship Committee: Coralyn Hudik reported that the Never Too Young group will be having a Bible Trivia night at 6:00 pm on August 29 in the Fellowship Hall. Everyone is asked to bring finger food to share. She also reported that Donna and Dale Gullickson will again be hosting the annual Wine and Cheese Party at their home on September 25, 2021. Rising to the challenge

It's been said that amazing things do not happen in our comfort zones, that we need to get comfortable being uncomfortable. I would say, too, that change rarely happens in our comfort zones. Change forces us into unfamiliar and unpredictable territory.

I shared those words with our churchwide executive board two years ago as it received the report and recommendations of an exploratory committee tasked with examining how best to fulfill Women of ELCA's mission and purpose in a changing world. That was in October 2019, when we knew nothing of the impending coronavirus pandemic and the huge changes that were looming.

We didn't seek the changes this global pandemic brought upon us, but we've had to deal with them nonetheless-changes both small and significant. From worship to schooling to medical visits, we shifted from in-person experiences to virtual ones, almost overnight. Those working in offices abruptly shifted to working from home. Instead of grocery shopping in person, many moved to having items delivered. While some activities could be changed from in-person to virtual, others stopped altogether-sporting events, concerts, performances, large gatherings. Only time will tell what will be gone forever and what is simply on a lengthy hiatus. Maybe some new iteration will evolve that we cant's even imagine right now.

We all were forced into unfamiliar, unpredictable territory. We had to figure out creative ways to accomplish what needed to be done, whether we wanted to or not. In fits and starts we managed the uninvited changes wrought by the global pandemic. There have been days when we've risen to all the challenges and responded well. Or just as many occasions, we fell flat. But overall, we've responded with creativity and flexibility. We've come to realize what we can control and what we cannot control.

We've had to adapt quickly, making on-the-spot decisions at times. We came to expect the unexpected and learned how to manage with so many unknowns.

Our organization has faced some changes, too, in all its expressions. Changes in staffing, budgets, the frequency of this magazine, how we conduct business, when we meet. We've moved into unfamiliar and unpredictable territory, and we have risen to the many challenges, showing we are resilient and adaptive. I believe our organization will be stronger for it all. That resiliency is what has allowed women's organizations to exist in the North American Lutheran church since the last half of the 19th century.

What has not changed because of the global pandemic? The transforming and redeeming love of God in Jesus Christ. While everything around us is shifting, how good it is to rest in the sure knowledge that "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). We are grounded in this assurance and in Jesus' command that we love our neighbors as ourselves. Whatever change comes our way, we are equipped to meet the challenge.





Martin Luther's Small Catechism

The Sacrament of Holy Baptism

How can water do such great things?

Clearly the water does not do it, but the word of God, which is with and alongside the water, and faith, which trusts this word of God in the water. For without the word of God the water is plain water and not a baptism, but with the word of God it is a baptism, that is, a grace-filled water of life and a "bath of the new birth in the Holy Spirit," as St. Paul says to Titus in chapter 3, "through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. This Spirit he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. The saying is sure."
