Thoughts from the Vicar

Greetings in Christ,

I am honored to be with you all as your new Vicar during this interim time as we journey together as God's people. I look forward to the new adventure for all of us, to the opportunity and responsibility of serving you, and I especially look forward to get to know each of you. And I'm sure many of you are wondering about me. So let me introduce myself.

I'm an Iowa farm-boy. I grew up on a chicken farm in Northwest Iowa just outside a very small town. We had 5,000 chickens, which my brother and I had to feed and collect the eggs just about every day. And our Lutheran church, with its little choir (which my father directed), and its rich pot-luck dinners, was the hub of the community, where my faith and understanding were nourished in my younger years. I then attended Luther College in Decorah, Iowa, majoring in Philosophy and Religion, and it is there that I met my wonderful wife, Coral. She had grown up on Long Island, New York, in the suburbs outside of New Your City. She's an artist and a loving mother and grandmother.

After we were married I went on to earn a Masters degree in Theology from Wartburg Seminary in Dubuque, so my Lutheran roots are deep and strong. We raised our three children-our son, Christian and our two daughters, Rachel and Arwen - in the Janesville, Wisconsin area. We then had the opportunity to move to England, where I worked as a computer engineer for 17 years, initially in London, but then in the very Northern of England, just south of Scotland. We are not fond of big cities, so we chose to live in small communities in the English countryside, including living for a time in a (haunted) 17th Century farmhouse, where our landlord kept a flock of sheep, munching away on the grass behind the house. We were drawn to small country churches, but we were also privileged to be members for a time at Durham Cathedral, one of the most beautiful holy place in all of Britain, where Christians have been worshipping continuously for 900 years.

And now we have been back in the States for about 7½ years. We have 7 grandchildren, all in Janesville where our two daughters live, and I am pleased to once again be among Midwest farmers. You may find that I enjoy singing and writing music, and writing books, and although I do like to brag about my farming background, I'm not really very good at it. Since coming home, Coral and I have each has a bout with cancer, but are doing well now. And Coral is now helping to take care of our daughter, Rachel, who is currently going through cancer treatments herself.

Most of all, I love God, and I love the Bible, and I love sharing the Gospel, the good news about our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, the Son of God, whom we all are privileged to worship and follow. And although I still work some as a computer engineer for IBM, I am now nearing completion of the process for ordination in the ELCA, needing only to serve an internship. I look forward to our time together in the days ahead.

Highlights from July 15th Church Council Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Council was called to order by President Wayne Kurth at 6:40pm on July 21, 2022

Secretary's Report: The July 21, 2022 Secretary's Report was presented and reviewed. Having no additions or corrections, the report was approved.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Jay Andrews reported that although the July offerings for the start of July are improving, there is still a shortage of about \$2,300 in the budget. The checking is currently \$788.00 in the red. The overall budget offerings are falling quite short for the year.

Gas Bill \$927.86 Electric Bill \$127.75

The Treasurer's Report was approved as presented.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Miho Yasukawa noted that Bishop-elect Stacie Fidlar's installation will be on October 8, 2022 at Trinity Lutheran Church in Rockford. The Food Pantry has been busy. Needs keep increasing as prices continue to rise. In May the Food Pantry served 75 families including 213 individuals. In June they served 75 families including 239 individuals. On July 12 the Mobil food Pantry served 131 families. Pastor Miho wished to thank the Council for all their prayers, comments conversations, all "holy" angers, sharing joy and exhaustion. Pastor's Report was approved as presented.

Committee Reports:

Stewardship Committee: The Community Picnic is progressing. There is a sign-up sheet on the ramp for food. Paper products, plastic silverware, water, and ice cream will be provided. The Men's Group will be grilling hamburgers and hot dogs. Also looking into the cost of putting an ad in the Shopper's Guide to promote the picnic.

Learning and Youth Committee: On August 6, 2022 there will be a Back to School Family Fun Day at Citizens State Bank Parking Lot from 1pm – 4pm (rain date August 13). The Lena Lions Club has generously donated \$250.00 to purchase prizes for games and other items needed for the afternoon. Thank you to the Lena Lions Club. The Learning Committee is looking for volunteers to help with the games. On August 28, 2022 there will be the kick off for Sunday School. This will be from 9:00 am to 9:30 am in the church sanctuary. It will be a simple format of Bible Stories, songs, opening and closing prayers. Their next meeting will be Sunday, August 14, 2022 at 11:00 am.

Service Committee: Need volunteers for the Food Pantry. Please sign up.

Finance Committee: The committee had a meeting on Tuesday, July 12, 2022. After a long discussion, the Finance Committee recommends that the Church Council hold a Special Congregational meeting to determine what the Congregation would like to do about the finances of the Church. It was suggested to hold the meeting in mid to late August. The Finance Committee noted that with Pastor Miho Yasukawa leaving and the need for an Interim Pastor, that our costs will be different. Following more discussion, Virgil Gordon made a motion to have a Special Congregational Meeting on August 21, 2022 following the Worship Service at 10:30 am.

Highlights from July 15th Church Council Meeting

- Finance Committee: The Agenda for the meeting would be the Church Finances and Future Pastoral Leadership. These will be the only two items discussed that day. There will be announcements made from the Pulpit on August 7 and 14, 2022.

 Announcement will be put in the August Newsletter. The possibility of Zoom will also be explored. Kristi Patterson seconded the motion. The motion was approved by voice vote.
- **Property Committee:** The Property Committee is recommending putting Gutter Guards on the Church. Noting an error in the Property Committee's presentation to the Council, the Council sent the recommendation back to the Property Committee for clarification.
- **Executive Committee:** The Executive Committee will be meeting on Tuesday, July 26, 2022 at 7:00pm for Pastor Miho Yasukawa's Exit Interview with Rev. Denver Bitner.
- **WELCA:** The NIS WELCA Convention will be held September 17, 2022 at Prince of Peace Church in Freeport. If anyone wishes to attend, talk to Sheila Keen for information.
- **Men's Group:** The Men's Group will be meeting on July 30, 2022 at 4:30pm. They will be grilling for the community Picnic/Pastor's Farewell on August 7, 2022.

Having no other Committee Reports, all reports were approved as presented.

Old Business:

- **Constitution:** The draft of the New Constitution has been sent to the Synod. The Synod has replied with some suggestions for changes in the wording of some portions. The Committee will be meeting to work on these suggestions.
- **Shared Ministry:** Will be working with St. Paul's, in Warren, on considering our options to this proposal.
- **Membership:** Beth Martin and Wayne Kurth sat down and went over the Membership List. They found a number of members to investigate as to whether to consider them active members, inactive members, or associate members.
- **Fall Festival Booth:** The Church Council decided to have a booth at the Fall Festival this year at a cost of \$60.00.

New Business:

Call Committee: The Council was asked to think about possible members to serve on the Call Committee. It was voiced by the Council that if St. Paul's, in Warren, wished to continue to exploring the options of the Shared Ministry, that members from their congregation should be included on the Call Committee.

Having no other business before the Council, the meeting was adjourning with the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting will be on August 18, 2022 at 6:30pm.

Ms. Loni Whitford Taylor is the keynote speaker



Ms. Taylor has been council president of Our Saviour Lutheran Church, Rocky Boy's Indian Reservation in Montana for the past 7 years, she is also an Emergency medical technician, a member of the Chippewa Cree Council of Rocky Boy and of the ELCA.

I've been the church council president of Our Saviour for seven

years. One thing I'm very proud of is that we are housing a Cree language revitalization program. There are nine trainees and two instructors. One of the instructors is my paternal grandmother, Pearl. One of my younger brothers is the program's director. It started in February, and after 14 months the trainees will be fluent Cree speakers. Those are prayers answered from our ancestors. When our tribal leaders and elders helped build this log chapel, they had intentions, prayers and hopes that our language would carry on, and now in this day, our language is being housed in the mission.

Our congregation is really small, but the community knows we are there, and they can rely on our church for different things. To me, our congregation is our community, even though they don't all come to church every Sunday. We have lots of our ceremonies at the church, and our community members utilize prayer services. I believe we all pray to the <u>same creator</u>, the same God.

I really like being on the ELCA Church Council because of all the different individuals I've been able to meet and become friends with. There are so many prayerful individuals I've gotten to know, and I'm so thankful for that. I'm also thankful for being able to learn from Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton and the other council leaders. They're faithful and open to listening. I hope that we can have more people from younger generations be involved in our church—locally, nationally and globally.




