Thoughts from the Vicar

Greetings in Christ,

In the midst of Lent there is a sequence of four days that mark the lives of three very dedicated saints, who each offer us inspiration:

March 17th - Saint Patrick - Patrick was a British Christian who was captured by Irish pirates around the year D 400 at the age of 16 and made a slave. He managed to escape six years later, became a priest, but then felt called by God to return to Ireland, in spite of the danger of having been a runaway slave, to preach the Gospel there. He became the "Enlightener of Ireland" and converted the Irish to Christianity. We have a wonderful hymn in the ELW (# 450) - "I Bind Unto Myself Today" - attributed to Saint Patrick, in which we may wrap ourselves in the presence of God through our faith in the divinity and life of Jesus and through our unity with God's creation and creatures.

March 19th - Saint Joseph - The husband of Mary and the guardian of our Lord, Joseph answered God's call to take Mary as his wife, trusting that her child was the true Son of God. He then took on the task of raising and caring for Jesus as he grew up, but he seems to have died without seeing Jesus' mission come to fruition. He is a strong example for us of faith and perseverance. [But because his feast day falls on a Sunday this year, we commemorate him on Monday instead.]

March 20th - Saint Cuthbert - Not mentioned in the ELW or celebrated by Lutherans for the most part, Cuthbert, bishop of Hexham and Lindisfarne, was perhaps the most beloved of all the Celtic Saints. Our dear Durham Cathedral, where Coral and I were members for about eight years, was built as his shrine, and he is buried there behind the great altar. His affinity with animals helped to influence that other great saint, Francis of Assisi, and his unswerving devotion to God and gentle care for his people have kept his name alive in the North of England for 16 centuries. Ask me some time to tell you about the Miracle of Saint Cuthbert that saved Durham Cathedral from destruction during World War II. I personally witnessed the effects of that miracle, although in a much safer situation.

As we journey together through the days of Lent, following Jesus to the Cross, it is a comfort to know that men like Patrick, Joseph, and Cuthbert are still a part of our "pilgrim band", walking alongside us as we seek to walk in the footsteps of our Lord.

Good Shepherd Scholarship Applications for 2023

The criteria for eligibility are as follows:

- 1. Participating member of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church.
- 2. Graduating senior presently enrolled in college, or a returning college student.
- 3. Full time student with a minimum of 12 credit hours.
- 4. Student entering an Associate or Bachelor degree program.
- 5. Thorough completion and timely return of application.
- 6. Adult student returning for courses toward certification, associates or bachelor degree.

Since 1997, seventy-four scholarships have been awarded.

Applications for 20223 scholarships will be available March 29,2023 at the church office. They must be returned to the church office by April 30,2023.

Recipients may not reapply for additional scholarships.

Amount of scholarship is not to exceed \$1000, and may be less than this amount as demand requires. Also offered is a \$200 award for adults returning for class work.


