Thoughts from the Vicar

We've been saying these words as part of the Eucharistic Prayer recently, as we thank God for the sacrament of Holy Communion, especially during the festive season of Easter as we have rejoiced in the resurrection of Jesus, and in the promise of our own resurrection through him.

Now, as we celebrate Pentecost, these words are even more appropriate. The Holy Spirit did come to the Church at Pentecost, and to each one of us individually at our baptism. But the coming of the Holy Spirit is not just a one-time event, and now it's over. The Holy Spirit continues to come to us each and every day as we pray and live out our lives as Christians, dedicated to giving God's love to all those around us. And indeed, it is that Holy Spirit who gives us the power and the ability to live as God's people.

We have celebrated the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus through the feasts of the liturgical year, but now we begin to celebrate the life of the Church in response to all that Jesus has done for us during the long "Green" season that will last from now until the end of November.

During this time, it is important for us to worship together as a community of faith. We all need the love and the encouragement we give to each other through the Holy Spirit. Paul tells us that "there are varieties of gifts, but... it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good". [I Corinthians 12:4-7]

Even though the COVID "emergency" is officially over, we do still need to be careful and attentive about taking the chance of spreading this or other diseases, but there is no longer a need to remain isolated. Our time of worship as a unified community within the Church is so important, and we all benefit from the presence of each other on Sunday mornings. So I encourage all of you to share your gifts with the rest of us as we worship together at Good Shepherd. We need you and appreciate how the Holy Spirit works through each one of you.

Highlights from April 20, 2023 Council Meeting

The April 20, 2023 regular monthly meeting of the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church Council was called to order by President Jonathon Kurth at 6:35pm.

- **Agenda:** The Agenda was reviewed. The Lena Food Pantry distribution (rent) was added to the Agenda. The Agenda was approved.
- **Secretary's Report:** The Secretary's Report was reviewed. There was a typing error found and corrected in the report. The Secretary's report was approved.
- Treasurer's Report: The offering for March was around \$4,000 and the budget is currently \$4,500 in the hole. Currently, the main problem is the gas bill. With the current price of the gas and the cold weather, it is high. There is also the fact that the Church is considered a Commercial Account which means there is a large service charge on the bill every month. There was a question of if the Church could go on a budget plan. This will have to be checked.

Gas Bill: \$1,319.56 Electric Bill \$223.57

The Treasurer's report was approved.

• Vicar's Report: Vicar Thomas Mosbo presented his Vicar's Report. With the events of Palm Sunday and Holy Week he was unable to do as much visiting with the shut-ins and others of the congregation in late March and early April. Between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday he prepared five Worship Service opportunities for the congregation to worship. Vicar Thomas also officiated at Paul Fox's funeral and provided pastoral care for the family. He also other church functions, attended several meetings, and preached at Sunday morning service. Vicar Thomas also commented that there were quite a number of children at the regular Easter Sunday worship service. Vicar's Report was approved.

Committee Reports:

- Stewardship Committee: There will be an Ice Cream Social on May 28, 2023 during the Fellowship Hour.
- **Property Committee:** Still waiting for Molitor Plumbing to finish the job on the boiler and also checking on when the Gutter Guards could be finished. The Committee will be having a meeting on Monday April 24, 2023.
- **Scholarship Committee:** The Scholarship Applications are available to be filled out and returned to the Scholarship Committee.
- **Memorial Committee:** An explanation of what the Enduring Gift Fund was and how it was to be used. Treasurer Jay Andrews explained the principals of the fund. Men's Group: The Men's Group is planning to work on the storage shed out back of the church. The Cub Scout Bear Den is planning to help as needed.

The History of Pentecost

In the Hebrew Scripture, the Jewish people celebrated a holiday known as the "Festival of Weeks" (see Exodus 32 and Deuteronomy 16). This was a harvest festival, a time when the Israelites celebrate the generosity of God, shown in a successful harvest of grain.

While the Temple stood in Jerusalem, each farmer would bring their *first fruits* – the first ripe samples from their fields – and give them as an offering of thanksgiving in the Temple. This meant that many Jews from all across the countryside would gather in Jerusalem in order to present their offering at the Temple.

The Festival of Weeks happened fifty days after the Passover. For this reason, the Greekspeaking Jews of the first century called the festival "Pentecost" – from the Greek word meaning "fiftieth day."

It was during the Festival of Weeks, fifty days after Passover, that the disciples of Jesus were gathered in Jerusalem. They had spent the last fifty days making sense of their experiences of the resurrection of their teacher, Jesus, and the fact that he had just ascended into heaven (for this whole account, see the book of Acts, chapters 1 and 2).

While the disciples were gathered, the Holy Spirit filled them. They began to tell to the pilgrims who were gathered in Jerusalem about Jesus. As they preached they were amazed to discover that all the pilgrims – regardless of what language they spoke – were able to understand them.
