


Edmond Louis Budry (August 30, 1854 – November 12, 1932) was a Swiss hymn writer famous for writing the lyrics to the hymn **"Thine Be the Glory"** ("À toi la gloire") to music from *Judas Maccabaeus* by George Frideric Handel.

The hymn was written in 1884 and appeared first in *Chants Evangeliques* (1885). A translation by Richard Birch Hoyle (1875-1939) gave the hymn increased visibility, especially when it appeared in the first edition of the hymnal for the World Student Christian Federation, *Cantate Domino* (1924). *The Methodist Hymn Book* (1933) was the first European hymnal to include the hymn.

The inspiration for this hymn, according to Budry's friend Paul Laufer, came from the words of Friedrich-Heinrich Ranke (1798-1876), published to the tune, MACCABAEUS, by George Fredrick Handel (1685-1759). The tune was adapted from a processional song in Handel's oratorio Joshua (1747), as well as later versions of the more famous oratorio Judas Maccabaeus (1746).Budry freely adapted Ranke's Advent text and transformed it as an Easter hymn. As Gaely recognized, the Easter text "emphasized still more the triumphal nature of Handel's music." John Wesley, a contemporary of Handel, enjoyed this tune very much and cites it as one of his favorites in journal entries for March 29, 1774, and March 30, 1787.

Edmond Budry was born in Vevey, he studied theology in Lausanne and was a pastor at Cully and Sainte-Croix between 1881 and 1889. He then became pastor of the Free Church in Vevey for a further 35 years, retiring in 1923. Besides writing original hymns, he translated German, English, and Latin lyrics into French. Some of his work was translated into German by Johanna Meyer (1851–1921). He died in Vevey and is buried in Cully.

Highlights from February 24, 2025 Church Council Meeting

Good Shepherd Council met February 24. Devotions and refreshments were provided Following additions and corrections, the agenda was approved

Secretary's Report: The Secretary's Report was presented and approved.

- **Treasurer's Report:** Treasurer Jay Andrews presented the Treasurer's Report. Church books are in the black. The full report approved.
- **Pastor Mosbo's Report:** Pastor noted that the Annual Meeting of the Congregation went well. Pastor Thomas also said that he has been working on the Ash Wednesday Service. Pastor's report was approved.

Committee Reports

Worship and Music Committee: Pastor Thomas noted that Karen Niemeier has been working with Theresa Woodbury and Kathy Clay to take over the position of changing the Paraments. The committee also worked out the Lenten Season services and music.

Learning Committee: Sunday School is going well.

Property Committee: The new church sign looks very nice. A new humidifier has been purchased for the church. The boiler is working well.

Having no other committee reports, the committee reports were approved.

Old Business

Constitution: The Constitution Committee had a meeting to look over the revisions that the Synod suggested. They made changes and the Constitution has been sent to the Synod for approval.

New Business:

- **Scholarship Distribution:** The Scholarship Committee is requesting the Church Council approve the distribution of funds to Sarah Geiseman and Lucas Fye for completing the Scholarship requirements. Motion approved.
- **Global Missionary Support:** Treasurer Jay Andrews noted that Ray Stamm had set up a fund for the church and that part of that fund was for Global Missionary Support. The church had been supporting the Stubbs Family in the past, but they are no longer doing missionary work. Jay Andrews has a list from the Synod of several other missionary's that need support. The council selected Dr. Steven and Bethany Friberg who are working in Tanzania to support. Motion to support the Friberg's mission ministry was approved.
- **Snow Removal:** Discussion on the snow removal around the church was held. Property Committee will speak to Andrew Martin about the timing of snow removal for the church.
- **Funding Request:** Anna Patterson sent a letter to the church requesting help in funding a mission trip thru CRU (a campus ministry) at Northern Illinois University. CRU is going to Panama Beach Florida for Spring Break to minister to other college students. She is requesting a donation from the church of \$500. Sponsorship for Anna was approved for \$500, to be taken from the Special Fund Endowment.

March Meeting: As that there was a conflict with the February Council Meeting date it was suggested that the March meeting might be skipped. It was noted that the current Constitution states that there should be a monthly meeting of the Church Council. The March meeting will be held on it's regular meeting day.

Correspondence: President Kristy Patterson read a letter from the NICAA Senior Citizen Services concerning the Golden Meals Program. They are looking to boost their funding. A motion was made to donate \$200 from the Special Funds Endowment to the Golden Meals Program. The motion was approved.

Other Correspondence was about the Congregational Resourcing Event (CRE) to be held at Sauk Valley College on March 22, 2025. registration for the event is on March 10, 2025.

Having not other business before the Church Council, motion to adjourn was approved. The meeting was adjourned with The Lord's Prayer.

Feel Good About Who You Are A 4-year olds Letter to God

There is a kind soul working in the dead letter office of the U.S. Postal Service somewhere...

Our 14 year old dog, Abbey, died last month. The day after she died, my 4-year-old daughter Meredith was crying and talking about how much she missed Abbey. She asked if we could write a letter to God, so that when Abbey got to heaven, God would recognize her. I told her that I thought we could, so she dictated these words:

Dear God,

Will you please take care of my dog? She died yesterday and is with you in heaven. I miss her very much. I am happy that you let me have her as my dog even though she got sick. I hope you will play with her. She likes to play with balls and to swim. I am sending a picture of her so when you see her you will know that she is my dog. I really miss her.

Love, Meredith.

We put the letter in an envelope with a picture of Abbey and Meredith and addressed it to: God in Heaven. We put our return address on it. Then Meredith pasted several stamps on the front of the envelope because she said it would take lots of stamps to get the letter all the way to heaven. That afternoon she dropped it into the letter box at the post office.

A few days later, she asked if God had gotten the letter yet. I told her that I thought He had. Yesterday there was a package wrapped in gold paper on our front porch addressed, "To Meredith" in an unfamiliar hand. Meredith opened it. Inside was a book by Mr. Rogers, titled, "When a Pet Dies." Taped to the inside front cover was the letter we had written to God in its opened envelope. On the opposite page was the picture of Abbey & Meredith and this note:

Dear Meredith,

Abbey arrived safely in heaven. Having the picture was a big help. I recognized Abbey right away. Abbey isn't sick anymore. Her spirit is here with me just like it stays in your heart. Abbey loved being your dog. Since we don't need our bodies in heaven, I don't have any pockets to keep your picture in, so I am sending it back to you in this little book for you to keep and have something to remember Abbey by.

Thank you for the beautiful letter and thank your mother for helping you write it and sending it to me. What a wonderful mother you have. I picked her especially for you. I send my blessings every day and remember that I love you very much. By the way, I am wherever there is love.
